

DEPARTMENT INFORMATION FOR INSURANCE INQUIRIES

Protection Class: 9/10

Types of apparatus:

- Five pumpers, (1) 1,000 gallon tank-2,000 GPM pump, (2) 1,000 gallon tank/1,250 GPM pumps, (1) 1,000 gallon tank/1,000 GPM pump, and (1) 400 gallon tank, 1,500 GPM pump. Three are located at Central Station and two at the Neck station.
- We use mutual aid tankers from Center Harbor, Holderness, Meredith, Sandwich, Tamworth, and Tuftonboro. All are 2,500 gallon tankers (Tamworth also has a 3,000 gallon tanker).
- Other apparatus are one heavy rescue truck, two EMS response vehicles, one brush truck (200 gallon tank-35 GPM pump), one utility pick-up, Chief's vehicle, one fireboat with 1,000 GPM pump, and one power boat.

Number of fire fighters responding to the emergency calls: Our average number of personnel responding to emergency incidents is 6. The average number of personnel responding to a building/structure fire is 14.

Type of Department: We are a combination department. There are paid personnel on duty Monday –Friday from 7 am to 5 pm. Call personnel respond on pager activation for night and weekend incidents.

Total gallons of water brought to a fire call: 4,400 gallons

Ability to run a water shuttle or relay: Yes

Mutual aid from other towns and possible amount of water brought for fire response:

Center Harbor (1,600 gallons), Holderness (2,500 gallons), Meredith (2,500 gallons), Sandwich (2,500 gallons), Tamworth (2,500 gallons & 3,000 gallons), and Tuftonboro (2,500 gallons).

Additional alternative water sources: Lake Winnepesaukee, Lake Kanasatka, Squam Lake. During the year when there is no ice on the lake; we have a fireboat with a 1,000 GPM pump. We also have acquired two Turbdraft units (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cyQvUHJFaj4>) that enable us to reach a water source up to 200 feet from the apparatus.
