The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 7 containers of municipal solid waste (84 tons), 5 containers of single stream recycling (25 tons) and 10 containers of construction and demolition (50 tons). The brush pile was burned, and compost pile was turned.

Car counts Monday 825, Tuesday closed 4th of July, Friday 1200, Saturday 626, Sunday 450 total 3101 vehicles. The Transfer Station was open 29.50 hrs. divided into 3101 = 105 vehicles per hour.

I would like to thank the Transfer Station staff for their hard work in the safe operation of the facility under very demanding conditions. Thank you to all of the residents who used the facility for being patient and understanding of the long lines and long wait time to offload their trash and recyclables.

Facilities/Grounds: The crew continues with weekly cemetery and grounds maintenance, as well as boat ramp and beach clean-up. We also adjusted the boat docks and assembled the raft for Long Island beach.

Fleet: Worked on Eq14 Loader road call for blown hyd. hose; Trk24 overheating issue/turbo hose/clean radiator; Car223 state inspection; 15E1 charging system/replace batteries; Trk1 auxiliary tank repair; Eq27 trailer light repair; Trk6 brakes; replace sweeper brushes;

Highway: The highway crew continued with grading, shoulder, and ditch work along several roads, and repaired several washouts from the heavy rain events. Road work last week included Bodge Hill Rd, Hanson Dr, Krainewood, Glidden, Lees Mill, Tara Rd, Winaukee Rd. Drainage improvements were made in Middle Neck Cemetery with the installation of an underdrain around the perimeter of the cemetery. We also had one cemetery burial.

Road Program: The asphalt rubber chip seal was completed last week on Paradise Dr, Severance Rd, Red Hill Rd.

Operations

- 7/1 The Fire Department participated in the Balmoral Independence Day parade, sending several trucks. The Fireboat provided coverage in Moultonborough Bay for a fireworks display being launched from a barge offshore of Balmoral Beach.
- 7/4 The Fire Department provided a color guard and multiple fire trucks for the Town's Independence Day. The Fireboat was relocated and stationed at Center Harbor Town Docks for the annual fireworks display. The boat and crew were on site for the unloading and transport by barge of the fireworks, then were on duty during the display to provide fire protection and enforce the 200-foot safety zone around the barge.
- 7/6 Lt. Frangelli has been working online with Vector Solutions to build the shift scheduling system in preparation for moving to 24-hour shift coverage. Two residential Supra box installations were performed.

Burning Permits: The seemingly endless rain has fire danger level at "Low." Fire permits are required for open burning, including campfires, and burning brush.
