The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 4 containers of single stream recycle = 20 tons, 9 containers of construction and demolition = 45 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The compost pile was turned, and the brush pile was burned.

Car counts Monday 525, Tuesday 566, Friday 650, Saturday 525, Sunday 348 total 2614 vehicles.

Facilities/Grounds: The crew continues to mow and trim cemeteries and town facilities, maintain boat ramps and beaches.

Fleet: Worked on Trk7 air dryer/governor/Pm/fuel filters; Trk18 strip for trade-in; Eq14 replaced cutting edges; 15-f-2 PM/tire issue; Eq25 PM/repair latches/chain case; WMF snow pusher repair.

Highway: The highway crew continues with grading, shoulder, and ditch work along several roads, and repaired several washouts from the heavy rain events. Also replaced street signs, placed cold patch, and did some tree work. Road work last week included Winaukee, Far Echo, Lees Mill, Red Hill, Sibley, Singing Eagle, Eagle Shores, Long Point, Harvard Camp.

Public Works Mutual Aid: Our highway team assisted the Town of Alton who encountered significant damage to several of their roads during the major rainstorm event over the weekend of July 15th. Monday July 17th – Thursday July 20th, we sent 2 staff along with our excavator and 10-wheel dump truck to assist with road repair work. Several; other communities from around the state sent dump trucks and manpower to assist as well. The Town of Alton greatly appreciated our assistance.
