Moultonborough Fire Rescue Department: For the period of 11/28/2022 to 12/05/2022, there were nineteen calls for service: There was: 1 – Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 12 – EMS incidents, 1 – Power line down, 2 – Public service assistance, 1 – Unauthorized burning, 1 – No incident found at dispatched location, 1 – Carbon monoxide detector activation due to malfunction. **Total 2022 Incidents: 977.** **Automatic Aid:** received twice from Stewart's Ambulance and once from Center Harbor. **Mutual Aid:** None. **Overlapping Incidents:** 1. **Year to Date:** 168. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 17.1%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

11/29 Training with Rescue 2 on drafting water from dry hydrants. Consultation with resident on requirements for installing a wood stove. Chief Bengtson and firefighter Houghton attended the Firefighter 1 graduation ceremony for Caleb Beede and Brandon Flanagan at the NH Fire Academy in Concord.

11/30 Administrative assistant Shea met with Alison Kepple to learn how to update the Fire Department web page to be more responsive to resident requests for information. The Day crew worked on preparing the snowplow on the Utility truck for clearing snow from dry hydrants. An oil burner inspection was conducted at 977 Whittier Highway.

12/1 Lt. Frangelli and FF. Brown attended Fire Officer 1 class. The Department received updated response tables from Wolfeboro Fire Department indicating the areas of Wolfeboro in which Moultonborough would respond to based on the level of alarm.

12/2 The Chief met with John McDonald to discuss updating the monitors in the meeting room to make them more compatible with regularly used media formats. The Day crew installed a Supra box at a Baden Street residence.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.covid19.nh.gov/> indicate that as of 12/05/2022, Moultonborough currently is shown as having six new cases in the last 14-days and has had a cumulative total of 829 cases. 20 % of the Town's population has contracted COVID-19 virus. 73.3% of the Town's population have completed the Primary Series. 44.3% have received a booster shot.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental

properties are reminded that “written permission” must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

No fire permits are required when the ground is covered by snow.

New fire permits are required January 1, 2023.
