The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Administrator: On the eve of Thanksgiving, I would like to give thanks to: our town employees for their dedication and commitment for providing daily public service to our community. From our police officers, fire fighters, paramedics, and building inspectors who keep us safe. To our public works staff that help build and rebuild our infrastructure. Our transfer station for keeping our environment clean and reducing waste. Our land use staff that help shape our future community growth. Our recreation and library for enhancing our community life. Our administration staff who take the aspirations of residents and the policy goals of our public officials and put them into action. Overall, it is the work of everyone involved that make me thankful for being part of a team that continues to build and improve our community.

Tax Collector: The confirmed Tax Rate for 2022 is \$4.78. The 2nd Half Real Estate Tax Bills are anticipated to be mailed out the first week of December. The due date will be January 11, 2023. Department of Public Works

FY2023 Road Program: Road construction for this year is coming to an end and will continue in the Spring for wearing course (topcoat) of pavement on States Landing Rd, Ferry Rd, and Old Long Island Rd as well as final shoulder/ditch work and loam/seed.

Lees Mill Retaining Wall: The concrete block wall has been installed for the Lees Mill Retaining Wall project and work is done for this year. The remainder will be completed in the Spring with final grading behind the wall, installation of plantings, and loam/seed. The island docks will also be installed in the Spring to finalize this portion of the project.

Facilities & Grounds: The past week the F&G crew has finished cemetery fall cleanups and we have serviced and put the mowers and trimmers away for the year. The boat docks have been

removed from states landing and lees mills. The new Christmas tree has been planted permanently by Miracle farms and the lights and wreathes will be installed next week. The F&G plows and sanders are ready to go, and the ice rink is being prepped for the season.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 5 containers of construction and demolition = 25 tons. Brush pile burned and compost pile turned. Car counts Monday 326, Tuesday 269, Friday 322, Saturday 404 Sunday 222 total of 1543 residents served.

The fire boat was taken out of the water for the season. The Department will still have a trailered boat and the hovercraft available for emergency responses.

11/17 The Chief attended the second day of the Municipal Association Annual Conference in Manchester. Lt. Frangelli and firefighter Brown attended Fire Officer 1 class in Campton. EMS continuing education was held, personnel trained on documentation & legal issues for EMS. Littleton Fire Department was given a building tour. The Day shift performed smoke detector checks for senior citizens.

11/18 Chief Bengtson met with Police Chief Beede for a discussion on mutual operational issues. Chief Bengtson consulted with a business owner on potential new construction.

11/19 Probationary firefighters Caleb Beede and Brandon Flanagan completed their practical skills exams for Firefighter 1 certification. Both passed their written and practical skills exams. The Fire Department and Chief Bengtson are please to present them with new helmet shields and congratulate them on becoming certified Firefighter Level 1. We are very proud of their efforts, dedication and commitment over the last 22-week period.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.covid19.nh.gov/> indicate that as of 11/21/2022, Moultonborough currently is shown as having seven new cases in the last 14-days and has had a cumulative total of 824 cases. 19.9 % of the Town's population has contracted COVID-19 virus. 72.8% of the Town's population have completed the Primary Series. 43.7% have received a booster shot.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

No fire permits are required when the ground is covered by snow.
