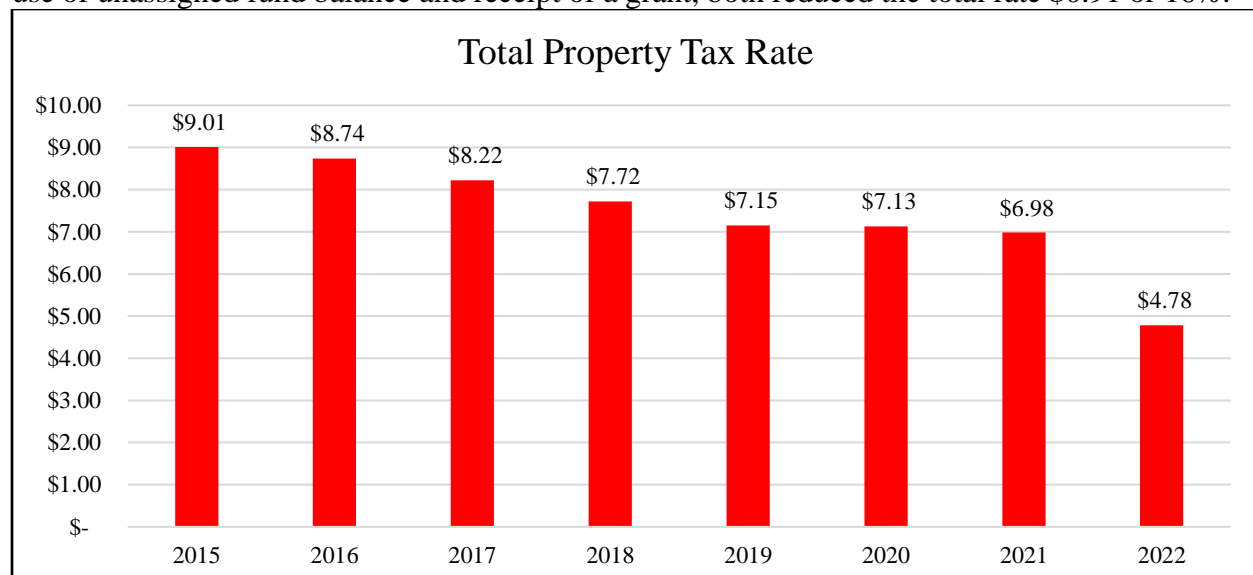
The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

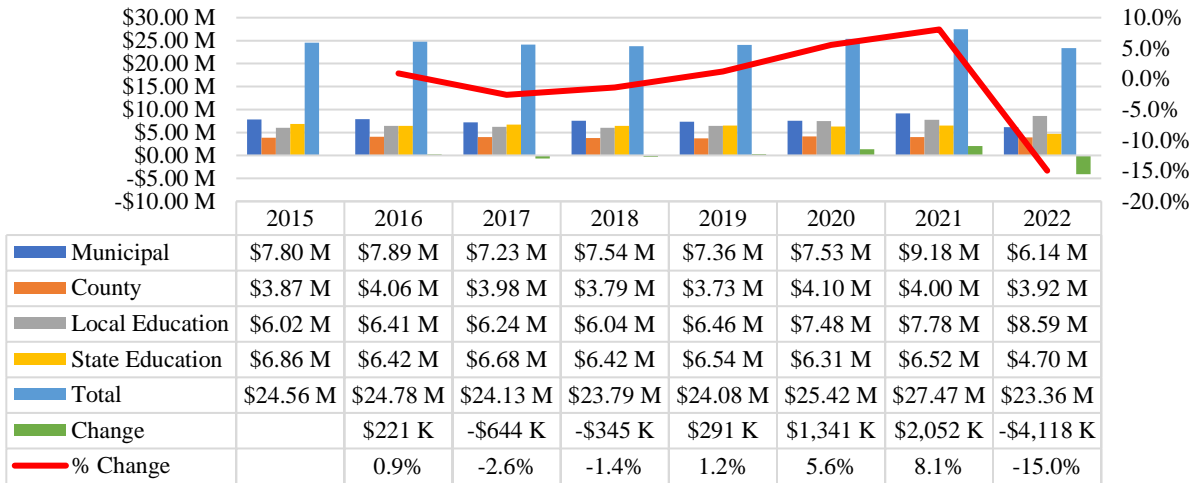
Town Administrator: Our 2022 property tax rate was finalized on Friday, November 18th by NH Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) and the Board signed the tax warrant last week, in which our Tax Collector then started the process of mailing tax bills.

The total property tax rate for 2022 is \$4.78 per \$1,000 of assessed value, which is a \$2.20 total reduction or 32% from last years rate of \$6.98. A few factors worth noting that went into the reduction; first being the lower tax efforts for the town, county, and state education, and second the town total valuation increasing 24% from \$3.94B to \$4.89B (\$948M increase). *Note: the property tax rate is calculated by dividing the tax effort into the total valuation and multiplying by (\$1,000).*

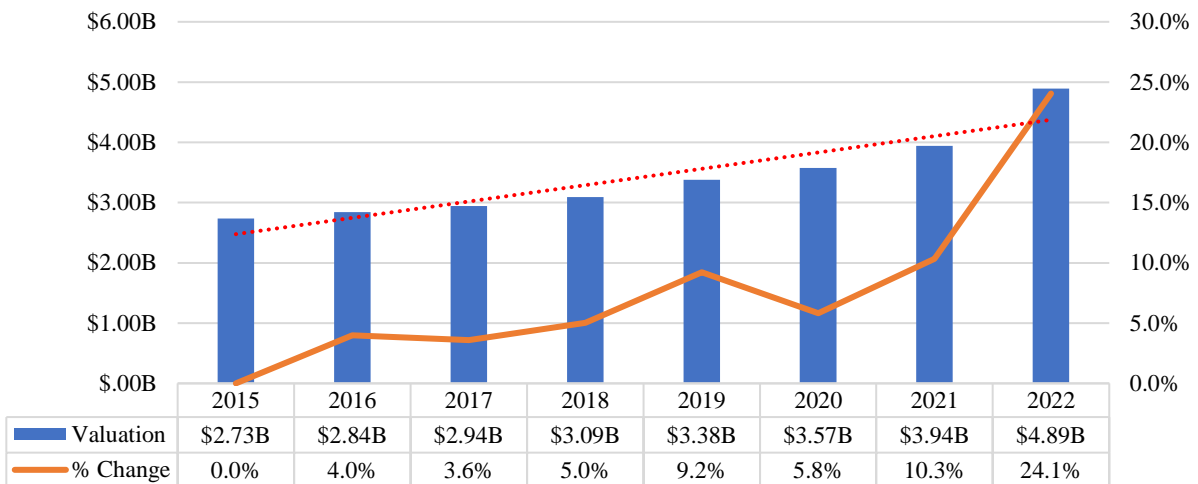
Our municipal tax effort was reduced \$3M from \$9.1M to \$6.1M as the town completed the fiscal year transition from an 18-month budget to a new budget year and further the Board voting to use \$2.65M of the unassigned fund balance. By using this amount (\$2.65M) the municipal rate for 2022 was reduced \$0.54. It is also worth noting that while the local education tax effort was not lower than years past the school did receive a one-time education grant (revenue) of \$1.795M that if it was not received then the local education rate would have increased \$0.37. If we combine the use of unassigned fund balance and receipt of a grant, both reduced the total rate \$0.91 or 16%.



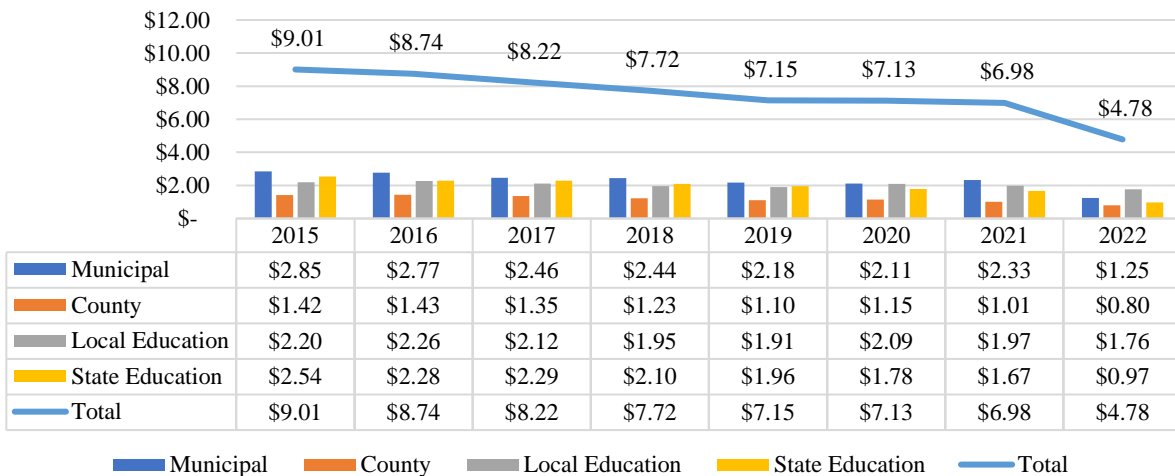
Tax Effort

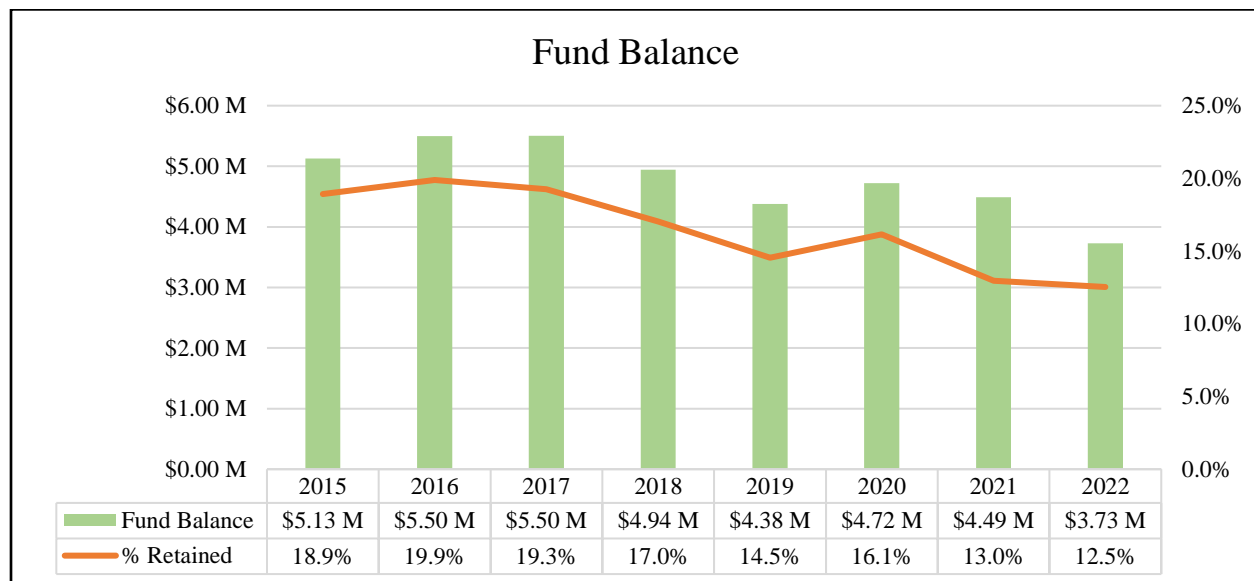


Assessed Valuation

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that “written permission” must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

No fire permits are required when the ground is covered by snow.

New fire permits are required January 1, 2023.
