The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Clerk:

Waterfront property owners: Don't forget your aqua-therm permit! If you have a bubbler/circulator on your dock, make sure you file it with the Town Clerk's office before the lake freezes. Aquatherm permits are only .50 cents per unit annually, but fines for unregistered units can reach up to \$1,000. These can be filed in person, through the mail or drop box, or online at MoultonboroughNH.gov.

Boat decals are in stock for the 2024 season! If you renew your boat now, you can put the sticker on and tuck the registration safely away before you store your boat for the season. Then, as soon as the ice melts in the spring, you'll be able to hit the water instead of standing in line or searching for a Boat Agent who has decals in stock.

To renew boats at the Town Clerk's office, we will need:

- The renewal letter from the state, signed by the primary owner, **OR** a completed [Boat Registration Application](#) (we have these in our office), **OR** the 2023 registration signed by the primary owner.
- Payment. Renewals processed in any town or marina will be \$5 more than the amount on your letter from the state. Checks need to be made out to **Town of Moultonborough** if being processed here.
- A government-issued photo ID for the person doing the registration (if done in person).

We accept cash, checks made out to **Town of Moultonborough**, and cards (a 3% fee is added by your credit card company for all card transactions). If you're paying by mail or the drop box, please include a self-addressed, stamped return envelope, and a contact number in case we have any questions.

Reminder: Boat Agents across the state frequently run out of decals during the spring season so processing your renewal now will ensure that you can use your boat as soon as you're ready in the spring.

(We are not able to process new boat registrations for 2024 until the new year. At this point in the season, we can only do renewals for 2023 or 2024 and new 2023 registrations.)

2024 Presidential Primary Information

The New Hampshire Secretary of State has announced that the First-in-the-Nation Presidential Primary will be held on **Tuesday, January 23rd, 2024**. Absentee ballot applications for qualifying voters may now be submitted to the Town Clerk's office.

To vote by absentee ballot in New Hampshire, individuals must be registered voters domiciled within the municipality where they are making their request and must meet at least one of the qualifications stated in section two of the [Absentee Ballot Request form](#). This form will need to be completed and returned to the Town Clerk's office in person or by email/fax/drop box (details below). Please bring a government-issued photo ID with you when applying for or returning an absentee ballot in person.

The drop box is located outside to the left of the Town Hall's front door (6 Holland Street). Completed absentee ballots can NOT be returned through the drop box, but applications may be submitted this way.

Painted Stop Bar. Road project on Abbott Road. Road work this week consisted of Redhill, Sawmill, Randell, Bodge Hill, Lees, Blake, Ben Berry, Hauser, and Ossipee Mountain Road.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Brush pile was burned, and compost pile turned. Car counts Monday 350, Tuesday 360, Friday 410, Saturday 350, Sunday 250 total 1720 vehicles.

Fire permits are not required when there is snow covering the ground. If snow cover is not present, a fire permit is required.
