The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Clerk: In the month of February 2024, the Town Clerk's office processed:

We also processed wetlands applications, voter registrations/party changes, absentee ballot applications, assisted new residents with establishing residency, received and verified petitions, and continued preparations for the May Town & School election, among other services. Town Clerk Julia Marchand was also grateful to be able to attend the Governor's State of the State Address on February 15th at the State House.

Dog Licenses: All dog owners are required by NH State law to register their dogs with their Town Clerk annually **by April 30th**. License fees are \$7.50 for spayed/neutered adult dogs, \$10.00 for unaltered dogs, \$7.50 for all puppies under 7 months, and \$3.00 for the first dog registered to an owner aged 65 or older. Pay early to avoid lines and fines!

You may obtain your dog license one of four ways:

1. In person: The Town Clerk's office is open 7:30 am – 4 pm, Monday – Friday.

2. Online: [Click here](#) or visit MoultonboroughNH.gov and look for “Online Bill Pay” then “Town Clerk Payments” and follow the prompts. We will process the transaction and mail you the new tag.
3. By mail: Send the proper fee (above), a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope to Town Clerk’s Office, P.O. Box 15, Moultonborough, NH 03254
4. Through the secure payment drop box: Inside an envelope marked “Town Clerk,” place the proper fee (above), a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope. Leave this in the secure drop box outside to the left of Town Hall’s front door. We will mail the new tag to you.

We can accept checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, cash, or credit cards if paying in person or online. There is a 3% processing fee added by your credit card company for all card transactions.

Boat Registrations: 2024 boat stickers are available! To renew your boat registration with the Town Clerk’s office, bring your renewal notice from the State (signed by the primary owner), last year’s signed registration, or a completed [Boat Application](#). **Please note:** there is an additional \$5.00 per boat Agent Fee for transactions processed through any town or marina – if you received a renewal notice from the State, simply add \$5.00 to the total listed for each boat you wish to register with the Town. When you register your boats locally, more of that revenue stays with the town than if you were to send payment directly to the state.

May Town/School Election Information: The filing period for candidates for both Town and School offices is March 27th – April 5th, 2024. Reach out to the Town Clerk or SAU office with any questions regarding filing for candidacy. Available positions for Town Offices are as follows:

Two (2) Select Board members for three (3) years
One (1) Moderator for two (2) years
One (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds for three (3) years
Two (2) Planning Board members for three (3) years
One (1) Treasurer for three (3) years
One (1) Supervisor of the Checklist for six (6) years
Two (2) Library Trustees for three (3) years
Two (2) Zoning Board of Adjustment members for three (3) years

The deadline to file petitions for town warrant articles is Tuesday, April 9th. All petitions must have the signatures of **at least 25 registered Moultonborough voters** to be added to the warrant. A copy of the current Moultonborough voter checklist is available to view in the Town Hall lobby if you wish to check over your petition prior to submission. The Town Clerk’s office will then verify that the required number of signatures has been met.

Absentee ballot requests can be submitted at any time for qualifying voters who cannot vote in person at the May Town/School election. [Request forms can be found here](#) and delivered to the Town Clerk by mail, email, fax, or in-person. Please bring a government-issued photo ID if dropping off your absentee ballot request in person.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: All building checks were completed; cardboard trash and recyclables were collected. Drains were flushed at the Public Safety Building and Leaf Cleanup was completed. The wood boiler circulator at the DPW garage was changed out. Town clerk paper was shredded. Met with HVAC at the Public Safety Building. The crew helped the school's superintendent with concrete bollards. Rope and flag were fixed at the library. Town clerks keyboard tray was repaired. Service reader boards set up. Trees were trimmed and removed from cemeteries.

Fleet: Picked up Trk4 at Crest Auto World. Paperwork and parts invoices were completed. 15-E-1 checked for air leaks and ordered parts. Eq23 Reset articulation system. 15-E-1 replaced purge valve in air dryer and checked for air leaks. Cleaned the shop. Exhaust on 15-E-1. Leak on Eq12 Skid steer attachment. Set up Trk2. Fixed broken weld on York rake.

Highway: The highway Crew continues with tree cutting/chipping and grading on the East side of town. Spot sanded on private roads. York raked roads townwide.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 5 tons and 5 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. Car counts: Monday 188, Tuesday 336, Friday 225, Saturday 345, Sunday 235 total vehicles served 1329.

Operations: 2/26/2024 The Chief's vehicle was sent to DPW for a scheduled repair of exhaust system. Chief Bengtson inspected the installation of oil burning equipment at 164 Lake Shore Drive. Moultonborough firefighters joined Center Harbor and Sandwich firefighters in a joint drill using UTV's for an off-road rescue at a construction site in Sandwich. 2/29/2024 Supra boxes were installed at residences on Hilltop Road and Spectacle Circle. 3/01/2024 Rescue 2 went to Lakes Region Fire Apparatus for a leaking discharge valve repair. Chief Bengtson performed an inspection at 32 Whitter Highway for a new healthcare business.

Burning Permits: Recent warm temperatures and rain have resulted in diminishing snow cover. If snow cover is not present, a fire permit is required. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Fire permits are not required when there is snow covering the ground 100 feet in every direction around the pile of brush to be burned.
