The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Finance and Administration

Did you know?

All dogs must be licensed every year by April 30th or the dog's owner is in violation of [RSA 466:1](#) and the police will be notified.

For the week of March 11th – March 15th, 2024, the Town Clerk's office processed motor vehicle and boat registrations, dog licenses, and vital records requests. We also processed wetlands applications, voter registrations/party changes, absentee ballot applications, assisted new residents with establishing residency, and continued preparations for the May Town & School election, among other services.

Dog Licenses: All dog owners are required by NH State law to register their dogs with their Town Clerk annually **by April 30th**. License fees are \$7.50 for spayed/neutered adult dogs, \$10.00 for unaltered dogs, \$7.50 for all puppies under 7 months, and \$3.00 for the first dog registered to an owner aged 65 or older. Pay early to avoid lines and fines! You may obtain your dog license one of four ways:

1. In person: The Town Clerk's office is open 7:30 am – 4 pm, Monday – Friday.
2. Online: [Click here](#) or visit MoultonboroughNH.gov and look for “Online Payments” then “Town Clerk Payments” and follow the prompts. We will process the transaction and mail you the new tag.
3. By mail: Send the proper fee (above), a note with the dog's name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope to Town Clerk's Office, P.O. Box 15, Moultonborough, NH 03254

4. Through the secure payment drop box: Inside an envelope marked “Town Clerk,” place the proper fee (above), a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope. Leave this in the secure drop box outside to the left of Town Hall’s front door. We will mail the new tag to you.

We can accept checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, cash, or credit cards if paying in person or online. There is a 3% processing fee added by your credit card company for all card transactions.

Boat Registrations: 2024 boat stickers are available! To renew your boat registration with the Town Clerk’s office, bring your renewal notice from the State (signed by the primary owner), last year’s signed registration, or a completed [Boat Application](#) to renew with the Town Clerk. **Please note:** there is an **additional \$5.00 per boat Agent Fee** for transactions processed through any town or marina – if you received a renewal notice from the State, simply add \$5.00 to the total listed for each boat you wish to register with the Town. When you register your boats locally, more of that revenue stays with the town than if you were to send payment directly to the state.

May Town/School Election Information: The filing period for candidates for both Town and School offices is March 27th – April 5th, 2024. Reach out to the Town Clerk or SAU office with any questions regarding filing for candidacy.

The deadline to file petitions for town warrant articles is Tuesday, April 9th. All petitions must have the signatures of **at least 25 registered Moultonborough voters** to be added to the warrant. A copy of the current Moultonborough voter checklist is available to view in the Town Hall lobby if you wish to check over your petition prior to submission. The Town Clerk’s office will then verify that the required number of signatures has been met.

Absentee ballot requests can be submitted at any time for qualifying voters who cannot vote in person at the May Town/School election. [Request forms can be found here](#) and delivered to the Town Clerk by mail, email, fax, or in-person. Please bring a government-issued photo ID if dropping off your absentee ballot request in person.

Please keep an eye on the website for future election information as it becomes available.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew continue with building and cemetery checks. Trash, leaf and recycling removal from all buildings. The lifeguard station was repaired, TV was hung at the PD, Domestic hot water was changed, changing station at the library was repaired. Bottled water was picked up at the bottling plant.

Fleet: The mechanics set up Trk5 with new chip box frame at weld shop. 15-E-1 fuel leak was repaired. York rake was repaired. Trk3 was brought to Crest Auto or recall on turn signals. Trk6 tailgate was repaired and lubed.

Highway: The highway crew continues checking roads, grading, tree cutting and cleaning catch basins.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 6 containers of construction and demolition = 36 tons. 78 Freon containing devices were evacuated of their gas. The compost pile was turned, and brush pile burned, 1 container of mixed scrap metal shipped.

Burning Permits: Fire Permits are now required for all open burning. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFire-Permit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Three types of fire permits are available:

Category I Fire – means a small, controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace and, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 25 feet from structures. Category I fire may be kindled with a permit at any time of the day whether raining or not.

Category II Fire - means a controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 4 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace and, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 50 feet from structures. A Category II fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit between 5:00 pm and 9:00 am unless it is actually raining.

Category III Fire - means any other fire, not a Category I or Category II fire or a fire greater than 4 feet in diameter or a fire not contained within a ring of fire resistive material and located at least 50 feet from structures. A Category III fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit between 5:00 pm and 9:00 am unless it is actually raining. A Category III fire permit may be issued for up to a maximum of seven days.
