The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Finance and Administration

Town Clerk:

Did you know?

The first dog licensing fees were set by state law in the late 1800s. In today's currency, the equivalent license fees would be \$74.82 for male dogs and \$187.04 for female dogs!

For the week of March 18th – March 22nd, 2024, the Town Clerk's office processed motor vehicle and boat registrations, dog licenses, and vital records requests. We also processed wetlands applications, voter registrations/party changes, absentee ballot applications, assisted new residents with establishing residency, and continued preparations for the May Town & School election, among other services.

Town Clerk, Julia Marchand, participated in testing of the new Statewide Voter Registration System in Concord. It will be released for use by election officials across the state later this year. Deputy Town Clerk Jennifer Boyll also participated in this test earlier this month.

Dog Licenses: All dog owners are required by NH State law to register their dogs with their Town Clerk annually **by April 30th**. License fees are \$7.50 for spayed/neutered adult dogs, \$10.00 for unaltered dogs, \$7.50 for all puppies under 7 months, and \$3.00 for the **first dog registered to an owner aged 65 or older**. Pay early to avoid lines and fines! You may obtain your dog license one of four ways:

1. In person: The Town Clerk's office is open 7:30 am – 4 pm, Monday – Friday.
2. Online: [Click here](#) or visit MoultonboroughNH.gov and look for “Online Payments” then “Town Clerk Payments” and follow the prompts. We will process the transaction and mail you the new tag.

3. By mail: Send the proper fee (above), a note with the dog's name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope to Town Clerk's Office, P.O. Box 15, Moultonborough, NH 03254
4. Through the secure payment drop box: Inside an envelope marked "Town Clerk," place the proper fee (above), a note with the dog's name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope. Leave this in the secure drop box outside to the left of the Town Hall's front door. We will mail the new tag to you.

We can accept checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, cash, or credit cards if paying in person or online. There is a 3% processing fee added by your credit card company for all card transactions.

Boat Registrations: 2024 boat stickers are available! To renew your boat registration with the Town Clerk's office, bring your renewal notice from the State (signed by the primary owner), last year's signed registration, or a completed [Boat Application](#) to renew with the Town Clerk. ***Please note***: there is an **additional \$5.00 per boat Agent Fee** for transactions processed through any town or marina – if you received a renewal notice from the State, simply add \$5.00 to the total listed for each boat you wish to register with the Town. When you register your boats locally, more of that revenue stays with the town than if you were to send payment directly to the state.

May Town/School Election Information: The filing period for candidates for both Town and School offices is March 27th – April 5th, 2024. The Town Clerk's office and the SAU office will both be open on April 5th until 5:00pm for the filing period only. Declarations of candidacy may be delivered by mail, email, fax, delivery agent or in person until April 4th. On the last day of the filing period, April 5th, declarations of candidacy may only be delivered in person by the candidate. Reach out to the Town Clerk or SAU office with any questions regarding filing for candidacy. Available positions for Town offices are as follows:

- Two (2) Select Board members for three (3) years
- One (1) Treasurer for three (3) years
- One (1) Moderator for two (2) years
- One (1) Supervisor of the Checklist for six (6) years
- One (1) Trustee of the Trust Funds for three (3) years
- Two (2) Library Trustees for three (3) years
- Two (2) Planning Board members for three (3) years
- Two (2) Zoning Board of Adjustment members for three (3) years

The deadline to file petitions for town warrant articles is Tuesday, April 9th. All petitions must have the signatures of **at least 25 registered Moultonborough voters** to be added to the warrant. A copy of the current Moultonborough voter checklist is available to view in the Town Hall lobby if you wish to check over your petition prior to submission. The Town Clerk's office will then verify that the required number of signatures has been met.

Absentee ballot requests can be submitted at any time for qualifying voters who cannot vote in person at the May Town/School election. [Request forms can be found here](#) and delivered to the Town Clerk by mail, email, fax, or in-person. Please bring a government-issued photo ID if dropping off your absentee ballot request in person.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The crew cleaned Lunt Cemetery along with the beaches. A burial was dug at Shannon, opened, and closed. Shelves put in at the Recreation Department, the library sink was addressed, the toilet at the Recreation Department was fixed, Public Safety Building meeting room walls were patched. Snow cleanup & plowing. In addition, the Buildings and Grounds crew continues building checks, picking up paper goods and dispersing them throughout town buildings.

Fleet: Trk20 injector set up, Eq42 set up blown hydraulic hose, Eq16 assembling door, getting correct fittings. Eq16 door swap. Trk20 sensor readings after cleaning. Eq32 installed fitting for hydraulic hose. York rake repair. Set up trucks for the winter storm. Plow and storm clean up.

Highway: The highway department continues to check roads, loosen up and rough grade and tree cutting. Culverts were measured for upcoming road projects. Trucks were set up to plow. Storm prep, and town wide winter storm clean up.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 1 container of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 5 tons, 6 containers of construction and demolition = 36 ton and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, and compost pile was turned. Car counts: Monday 263, Tuesday 228, Friday 383, Saturday 20 SNOWSTORM, Sunday 155 total 1049 vehicles served.

Operations: 3/18/2024 Chief Bengtson conducted place of assembly inspections at 60 and 1094 Whittier Highway. A chimney throat inspection was performed at 52 Snowy Street. Department training was conducted, a review of Forestry 1 and its equipment and pump operation was

performed. 3/21/2024 Paramedic John Burdette provided monthly EMS continuing education training on pediatric emergencies. 3/22/2024 Chief Bengtson and firefighter Tim Gatherum attended professional development training at the Tilton School. Tilton-Northfield Professional Fire-fighters Local 4659 hosted a training seminar on searching for victims without a hose line and reading smoke for tactical operations.

Burning Permits: Due to the recent snow, fire permits are not required to burn permissible materials. Snow is required for 100 feet in every direction around brush pile to be burned. Fire permits will be required as snow cover diminishes.
