The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The crew raked and stripped Lees Mills parking lot and blew off the bike path. Top soiled the lawn at the Town Hall and moved desk. Picked up trash on 109. New camera wire at the Transfer Station was put in. Dug a hole at States landing and poured concrete to place the bench on. The buildings and grounds crew continues to do building checks, collecting trash and recyclables along with brush and leaf clean up.

Fleet: The mechanics checked leak in Trk6, Trk24 A/C addressed and replaced tarp system. Refilled truck and checked for leaks. Trk24 grill was repaired, hood assembly installed. 15-B1 set up to pull motor out. They both attended an Advanced drivability diagnosis class in Manchester. The motor was pulled out of 15-B1. Inspection stickers in Tamworth. Eq25 reset traction motor. Eq17 set up knives and adjusted anvil.

Highway: The highway crew continues to check roads, grading and ditching and catch basins. They flagged for painter townwide, picked up and chipped brush. Loaded the rock hammer, hammered rocks on Lunt, Winaukee and Ferry Road, then, brought gravel to fill in the hole.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 7 containers of construction and demolition = 42 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Compost pile was turned, brush pile is continuously being burned, 38 Freon containing devices were evacuated. Vehicle counts Monday 278, Tuesday 366, Friday 391, Saturday 385, Sunday 240 total vehicles 1660. 47 vehicles were served per hour.

Operations: 4/22/2024 The Chief performed a rough-in inspection of NFPA 13D fire sprinkler piping at 309 Whittier Highway. The Duty crew installed a Supra box at an Echo Landing Road residence. Moultonborough, Center Harbor, and Sandwich fire departments conducted forestry firefighting training on Town-owned property on Highway Garage Road. During the controlled burn of 1/4 acre, personnel employed skills in establishing a fire line, overhauling logs and stumps and extinguishment. 4/23/2024 The fire chief performed an inspection of a single-family dwelling at 88 Suissevalle Avenue and a place of Assembly inspection at 240 Governor Wentworth Highway. The Duty crew and Call firefighters spent about five hours assisting with a search for a missing person on Lee Road. 4/24/2024 Chief Bengtson and firefighters Cavic and Manville inspected gas piping at 130 Beach Road. 4/25/2024 Chief Bengtson attended a meeting of the Lakes Region Fire Chief's in Gilford. An educational program was presented featuring speakers from Bergeron Protective Clothing and Globe fire Suits. The program was intended to provide information to the fire chief's on PFOA/PFA's in personal protective clothing and what options are available for purchasing PPE without PFOA/PFA's. The Duty crew installed replacement smoke detector batteries at 8 Alpine Park Road. Throughout the week the Duty crew and Call firefighters completed testing of all 1-3/4", 2-1/2", and 3-inch hose. The crew are to be commended; this is the earliest hose testing has been completed. Good Work people!!
