The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Clerk:

Did you know?

Despite a sharp dip in 2020 due to COVID, the Town Clerk's office is seeing an almost 7% average increase in boat registrations yearly. Boats registered locally make it possible for the town to hold onto some of those registration fees, as opposed to all of them going to the State. The money collected goes into the town's general fund, which helps offset our tax rate.

The Town Clerk's office has been busy processing motor vehicle and boat registrations, dog licenses, and vital records requests. We also processed wetlands applications, voter registrations/party changes, absentee ballot applications, and assisted new residents with establishing residency, among other services.

!! Dog Licenses: Late fees begin June 1st! All dog owners are required by NH State law to license their dogs with their Town Clerk annually **by April 30th**. License fees are \$7.50 for spayed/neutered adult dogs, \$10.00 for unaltered dogs, \$7.50 for all puppies under 7 months, and \$3.00 for the first dog registered to an owner aged 65 or older. Pay now to avoid fines! You may obtain your dog license one of four ways:

1. In person: The Town Clerk's office is open 7:30 am – 4 pm, Monday – Friday.
2. Online: [Click here](#) or visit MoultonboroughNH.gov and look for "Online Payments" then "Town Clerk Payments" and follow the prompts. We will process the transaction and mail you the new tag.
3. By mail: Send the proper fee (above), a note with the dog's name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope to Town Clerk's Office, P.O. Box 15, Moultonborough, NH 03254

4. Through the secure payment drop box: Inside an envelope marked “Town Clerk,” place the proper fee (above), a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope. Leave this in the secure drop box outside to the left of the Town Hall’s front door. We will mail the new tag to you.

We can accept checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, cash, or credit cards if paying in person or online. There is a 3% processing fee added by your credit card company for all card transactions.

Boat Registrations: 2024 boat stickers are available! To renew your boat registration with the Town Clerk’s office, bring your renewal notice from the State (signed by the primary owner), last year’s signed registration, or a completed [Boat Application](#) to renew with the Town Clerk. ***Please note:*** there is an additional \$5.00 per boat Agent Fee for transactions processed through any town or marina – if you received a renewal notice from the State, simply add \$5.00 to the total listed for each boat you wish to register with the Town. When you register your boats locally, more of that revenue stays with the town than if you were to send payment directly to the state.

May Town/School Election: Turnout for the election was the third lowest we’ve seen in the last ten years at 679 ballots cast. The lowest turnout was in 2017 at 547 voters, and second lowest was 2018 at 665. The largest turnout we’ve seen in the last decade was last year’s election, where we saw 1,374 voters cast their ballots.

May Town Meeting: Similarly, we saw a low turnout for this year’s town meeting, at 271 registered voters checked in, which is the third lowest turnout in the last decade. The lowest turnout was in 2017 at 247 registered voters, and the second lowest was 2015 at 258. The largest turnout we’ve seen was also last year, where 996 registered voters checked in and made their voices heard.

The Deadline to Change Party Affiliation Before the September 10th State Primary is Tuesday, June 4th

If you wish to change your party affiliation, please bring your government-issued photo ID with you to the Town Clerk’s office during normal business hours by the deadline, or to the Supervisors of the Checklist’s meeting from 7:00 – 7:30pm here at Town Hall on June 4th.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The Facilities and Grounds crew set banners and flags throughout the village. The bike path, Long Island, and States Landing beaches were raked and cleaned up. One full burial and two cremations were opened and closed. The blood drive was set up at the Lions Club. All building checks continue along with mowing and trimming throughout the town.

Fleet: Truck and equipment maintenance continues with, Eq12 Hydraulic leak, Eq23 Hydraulic leak, replacement of hose and cleaned the equipment of oil. The shop was cleaned. Large compactor and the hydro seeder not working. Road call on Eq12 for overheating. Car 162 was serviced. 15B1 motor rebuild and put back into the fire boat.

Highway: This past week the highway crew had interviews, screening at the Transfer station, checking beaver pipes, replaced culverts, grading, GMI reclaiming.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 10 containers of construction and demolition = 50 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The compost pile was screened, compost pile turned, brush pile burned, tire container shipped, and 12 cubic yards of Styrofoam shipped. Vehicle counts: Monday 300, Tuesday 333, Friday 585, Saturday 503, Sunday 400 total vehicles 2121 = 60 per hour, serviced by a four-person crew.

Operations: 5/20/2024 The Duty Crew and the fire chief performed underground LP gas tank and piping inspections at 41 Cortina Street and 57 Mountain view Drive. The Duty Crew installed a Supra key box at a Black Cat Island Road residence. Moultonborough hosted Tri-Town training at the Moultonboro Neck fire station with firefighters from Center Harbor, Sandwich, and Moultonborough practicing vehicle extrication tasks using Res-Q struts and air bags and the TL-9 Stabilizer. Dan Felix from Firematic Supply Co. provided instruction on the struts. Personnel were called away from training to respond to a second alarm building fire in New Hampton. 5/21/2024 Chief Bengtson, attended the Department Head meeting with the Town Administrator. The Fire Chief also attended an emergency meeting of the LRMFA Executive Committee in Laconia. 5/22/2024 The Duty crew and Chief Bengtson performed inspections of LP gas tanks and piping at 176 Castle Shore Road and 16 Lands' End Lane. 5/23/2024 Lakes Region Fire Apparatus performed annual pump testing of the Department's fire apparatus at Lee's Mills. The Duty Crew installed Supra boxes at residences on Windermere and Wiggin Farm Roads. The fire chief performed the annual life safety and fire code inspection at Geneva Point Center and assisted with the reunification drill conducted at Moultonborough Academy.

Burning Permits: Fire danger conditions continue to improve as things green-up, but residents should remain cautious as wind and dry leaves and grass can easily aid in rapid fire spread. Many residents have expressed problems obtaining fire permits using the on-line system. The on-line system is owned and operated by the State. Problems with the on-line system should be addressed through the customer service number provided. If unable to obtain a fire permit on-line, residents may obtain fire permits at the Public Safety Building. Permits will be issued when personnel are in the building, as we are an emergency service, sometimes we are not in the building, please be patient and try again later if no one is available to assist you.
