The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Town Clerk:

Did you know?

A bill of sale is not legal, [per RSA 261:148, III](#), unless it includes all of the following: date of sale, description of the vehicle (including year, make, model, VIN, year of manufacture, body type and number of cylinders), name and address of purchaser, and signature and address of seller. [Our Bill of Sale template](#) includes all the necessary information for a NH registration, so we recommend printing it off and using it for motor vehicle, boat, and trailer sales within our state.

The Town Clerk's office has been busy processing motor vehicle and boat registrations, dog licenses, and vital records requests. We also processed wetlands applications, voter registrations, absentee ballot applications, assisted new residents with establishing residency, and prepared for the fall elections among other services.

State Primary: There are only 6 weeks left until the September 10th, 2024, State Primary. The Town Clerk's office is hard at work preparing for the upcoming election. If you are not registered to vote yet, you may do so with the Town Clerk's office between now and Tuesday, August 27th. The Supervisors of the Checklist will be meeting on Wednesday, August 28th at Town Hall from 10:00 – 10:30am – unregistered voters may meet with the Supervisors of the Checklist at this time to be registered and added to the checklist. If you are unable to register to vote by these deadlines, you may do so in person at the polls on Election Day. New voters will need to prove their identity, age, domicile and citizenship when registering to vote.

The State Primary on September 10th, 2024, and the November General (Presidential) Election on November 5th, 2024, will both be held at the Moultonborough Academy gymnasium at 25 Blake Road, Moultonborough.

Absentee voters may submit their applications for absentee ballots at any time. Applications are [available online](#) and in our office. You may submit your completed application via mail, email, fax or in person (see below). We will keep your application on file and send your absentee ballot via mail as soon as the ballots become available. You can [track your absentee ballot status](#) online through the Secretary of State's website. Please contact the Town Clerk's office with any questions or concerns.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew continue with the weekly beach cleanup, mowing, trimming, and building checks. Trash and recyclables were collected throughout the town buildings. Drains flushed at the Public Safety Building. Paper products have been distributed throughout the buildings. Lees Mills and Long Island docks reset, Pickleball court blew off, cleaned gutters at the Neck station.

Fleet: The mechanics completed repair orders. Addressed 15-R-1 air issue, repaired supply system Eq39, pull street pads in Trk1 and battery issue. Pulled tires from Eq25 for foam filling. Road call for Trk7. State inspection and service for Trk4. Trk10 inspection. Shoulder machine: replaced broken chain with new one and adjusted. Loaded chip trailer. Trk5 belt issue. Picked up tires new Eq25 and installed hydraulic hoses.

Highway: The highway crew continues shouldering, adding gravel and stones townwide, hauling sand, checking catch basins, culvert cleaning and drilled Middle Neck Cemetery well.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition = 40 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. 20 cubic yards of Foam recycled, compost pile turned, and brush pile burned. Vehicle counts: Monday 660, Tuesday 590, Friday 651, Saturday 536, Sunday 310 total vehicles served 2747= 77 per hour.

Operations: 7/22 The Duty Crew performed eleven Supra Box inspections. 7/23 LP gas tank and gas piping inspection conducted at 311 Moultonboro Neck Road, 11 Abenaki Lane, and 43 Leeward Shores Road. An inspection of an oil tank was performed at 121 Redding Lane. Two Supra box inspections performed. 7/24 The Duty Crew assisted a resident with the installation of smoke detector at a Krainewood Drive residence. 7/25 The fire chief inspected an oil burner installation at 144 Windermre Road and a LP gas tank installation at 18 Sachem Drive. The Duty Crew brought Engine 4 to Playground Drive for the Rec. Dept Touch-a-Truck event. One Supra box inspection was performed. 7/26 Three Supra box inspections were performed. 7/27 Moultonborough Fire & Police Departments along with Stewart's Ambulance responded to Moultonboro Airport for a plane crash. Responding units found a small plane had crashed following the collapse of the nose gear. The pilot was uninjured and able to exit the aircraft. The aircraft was leaking fuel. Crews mitigated the fuel leak while Stewart's Ambulance evaluated the pilot. NH State Police, NH DES responded, and NH DOT was notified. The airport was closed while the incident was investigated.

Burning Permits: Fire danger conditions are improving as things green-up, but residents should remain cautious as wind and dry leaves and grass can easily aid in rapid fire spread. The Daily Fire Danger notifications can be obtained at <https://www.nhdfl.dncr.nh.gov/forest-protection/daily-fire-danger>

Many residents have expressed problems obtaining fire permits using the on-line system. The on-line system is owned and operated by the State. Problems with the on-line system should be addressed through the customer service number provided. If unable to obtain a fire permit on-line, residents may obtain fire permits at the Public Safety Building. Permits will be issued when personnel are in the building, as we are an emergency service, sometimes we are not in the building, please be patient and try again later if no one is available to assist you.

Fire Permits are now required for all open burning. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Rental property owners are reminded that fire permits are issued to the person, not the property. Renters will need written permission of the property owner to kindle fires on the property being rented. The renter will need to obtain a fire permit for the period in which they are renting the property.

Fireworks:

- You must be 12 years of age to buy and possess fireworks.
- Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with written permission from the landowner, or in the presence of the landowner. If you are renting property, you must have written permission from the landowner to display fireworks.
- The use and display of fireworks on Town property, beaches, and docks is prohibited.

Moultonborough Ordinance # 22 limits the use of fireworks to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight the holiday.
