The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew continue weekly building checks and trash and recycle collection throughout town buildings. Mowing and trimming was completed at Holland Hill, Bodge Hill, Mason, Middle Neck, Ambrose, Lee, Fosse, Freeze and Shannon Cemetery along with the Playground. Drains flushed at the Public Safety Building. Beaches were cleaned. Fire doors and facets were repaired at the Fire Station. Lines were painted at Lees Mills and the park. Library projects were completed. The oven at the Lions Club was repaired and septic was cleaned.

Fleet: Truck 6 air valves were replaced, and the system was checked for leaks, and preventative maintenance. Truck 2 wire issue, taillight was repaired. The garage was cleaned, work orders completed. Parts were picked up in Ossipee and put away stock. Belt and pulley was changed on Truck 5. Oil was pumped out of transport drums. Service on Truck 2 and safety check. Car 241 checked. Leak in Skid Steer. Broom lid on Eq 16 and tarp on Truck 24 repaired.

Highway: The Highway crew continues to shoulder, and ditch on Sibley Road, Lees, Ossipee Park and Ossipee Mountain. Roads checked from heavy rains. Grading and fixing washouts on Lunt, Far Echo, Ben Ayers. Pavement was measured for paving. Flushed culvert water on Tara. Material was hauled from the pit.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition = 48 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Brush pile was burned, compost pile was turned, 60 propane tanks were recycled, 12 cubic yards of foam recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday 502, Tuesday 585, Friday 495, Saturday 428, Saturday 363 = 2373 vehicles served = 67 per hour.

Operations: 8/19 Deputy Houghton and Lt. Gravelle conducted driver training for call and fulltime personnel. Using the parking lot at the Public Safety Building and traffic cones, they set up an obstacle course for backing and turning maneuvers. 8/23 The Duty Crew assisted DPW with flushing out a cross culvert on Deep Wood Lodges Road. Using the DPW's rotating nozzle, Engine 4 supplied water to open up the culvert pipe. Maintaining good drainage is essential for ensuring the delivery of emergency services. The Fire Department is happy to assist other Town Departments whenever needed.

Burning Permits: Fire danger conditions are improving as things green-up, but residents should remain cautious as wind and dry leaves and grass can easily aid in rapid fire spread. The Daily Fire

Many residents have expressed problems obtaining fire permits using the on-line system. The on-line system is owned and operated by the State. Problems with the on-line system should be addressed through the customer service number provided. If unable to obtain a fire permit on-line, residents may obtain fire permits at the Public Safety Building. Permits will be issued when personnel are in the building, as we are an emergency service, sometimes we are not in the building, please be patient and try again later if no one is available to assist you.

Fire Permits are now required for all open burning. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Rental property owners are reminded that fire permits are issued to the person, not the property. Renters will need written permission of the property owner to kindle fires on the property being rented. The renter will need to obtain a fire permit for the period in which they are renting the property.

Fireworks:

- You must be 12 years of age to buy and possess fireworks.
- Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with written permission from the landowner, or in the presence of the landowner. If you are renting property, you must have written permission from the landowner to display fireworks.
- The use and display of fireworks on Town property, beaches, and docks is prohibited.

Moultonborough Ordinance # 22 limits the use of fireworks to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight the holiday.
