The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: Facilities and grounds addressed the hot water tank at the library. Concrete was poured at the Transfer Station. Lions Club heat problem was looked at. Hydroseeding on town grounds. Potholes in salt shed were patched. The wood boiler was cleaned out for winter. Weekly building checks were completed, trash and recyclables collected. The drains were flushed at the park. Leaf blowing, trimming and cemetery checks continue.

Fleet: Driver side mirror was installed on truck 11. Truck 10 taillight mounts. The wood chip trailer was loaded. Truck 6 brakes were pulled apart. Car 181 windshield wiper was repaired. Four tires were mounted on 15-R-3. Paperwork, repair orders and invoices were completed. Road test for Truck 9. Truck 10 tailgate test. The shop was cleaned. Car 161 tire light was checked for leaks and pressure. Truck 10 brakes.

Highway: The highway crew prepped for GMI paving. Tree cutting continues. Added gravel to Evans Road and ditched. Plow frames were prepped for the winter season. Road signs replaced on Toltec Point Road and Richardson Shores Road.

Operations: 10/7 Multi-town Mass Casualty training at Sandwich Fairgrounds in preparations for Sandwich Fair Weekend. 10/8 Member of the fire department attended training provided by Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Communications Center on the new Tyler CAD, the CrewForce App and radio procedures. The training was held at LRCC. Moultonborough Fire Rescue assisted Sandwich Fire Rescue with operation through the Columbus Day Weekend at the Sandwich Fair.

Burning Permits: Fire danger conditions are improving as things green-up, but residents should remain cautious as wind and dry leaves and grass can easily aid in rapid fire spread. The Daily Fire Danger notifications can be obtained at <https://www.nhdfl.dnrcr.nh.gov/forest-protection/daily-fire-danger>.

Many residents have expressed problems obtaining fire permits using the on-line system. The on-line system is owned and operated by the State. Problems with the on-line system should be addressed through the customer service number provided. If unable to obtain a fire permit on-line, residents may obtain fire permits at the Public Safety Building. Permits will be issued when personnel are in the building, as we are an emergency service, sometimes we are not in the building, please be patient and try again later if no one is available to assist you.

Fire Permits are now required for all open burning. Fire Permits may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>

Rental property owners are reminded that fire permits are issued to the person, not the property. Renters will need written permission of the property owner to kindle fires on the property being rented. The renter will need to obtain a fire permit for the period in which they are renting the property.

Moultonborough Public Library

The Moultonborough Public Library offers digital downloads of ebooks, audiobooks, magazines and more through 2 mobile apps, Libby and Hoopla, to Moultonborough resident cardholders. The Libby app, once called Overdrive, gives our resident cardholders access to the NH Downloadables Collection. The Hoopla app provides access to books and magazines, but also to TV shows, movies and lots of children's digital content.

Starting on October 15, Libby and Hoopla are requiring a PIN, even for existing users. Patrons should follow the prompts given in both apps on their first use after October 15. Patrons can stop at the library for help with the PIN number at any time.
