The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: The Tax Collector and I have had a conference with Town Counsel in follow-up to his advice on how to best comply with the various court decisions on the sale of tax deeded properties and have begun needed revision and clarifications to our Policy #19 covering such sales for your consideration. I met with the Group working on a possible Nature Trail at Mudd Pond. They are going to do some one on ones with the property owners before proceeding further but have hopes of doing a public forum in January. Our first walk-thru at the function hall had two attendees and drew a few questions we are working on now.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The grounds crew set parking curbs at the library and bathroom signs at the Public Safety Building along with boiler maintenance. Trucks were set up with sanders. Cut trees and limbs at the Function Hall. The ice rink was cleaned. Parking lots and walkways salted after weather. Lights at the Town Hall were installed. Weekly building checks continue along with trash and recycle pick up. Over thanksgiving the crew provided winter snow removal and treatment throughout town.

Fleet: 15-u-1 rear exhaust connector was welded and undercoated. The wood chip trailer was loaded. Replaced wing hydraulic hose on truck 15. The new loader was set up. Trucks prepped for the storm, plowed, and treated the roads. Truck 1 sander issue was addressed and truck 2 plow hydraulic issues. Car 162 wipers.

Highway: Culvert was installed at the Transfer Station and the road was graded. The highway crew treated roads town wide and finished setting up trucks and organizing the shop yard for winter. Over Thanksgiving the crew plowed and treated roads from the storm.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition = 36 tons and one container of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, and the compost pile was

turned. Vehicle counts: Monday 380, Tuesday 245, Friday CLOSED, Saturday 295, Sunday 210 total vehicles served 1130 = 32 per hour.

Operations: The Thanksgiving Day snowstorm brought storm related activity with crews responding to three motor vehicle accidents over the holiday and the weekend. They also handle several calls for wires arcing related to the snow weighing down tree branches on the wires. The Duty crew responded to a fire alarm activation on High Haith Road in Center Harbor during the storm while Center Harbor crews were out on a medical incident.

Update on the damage to the fire boat, the Town received a check from Primex in the amount of \$13,573 for the boat. Meredith Marina has been given approval by the fire chief to begin repairs to the hull. Chief Bengtson is researching options to cover the \$28,100 deficit and replace both outboard motors.

Burning Permits: Despite recent rains the fire danger conditions are running between Moderate to Very High. Residents should remain cautious as wind and dry leaves and grass can easily aid in rapid fire spread. The Daily Fire Danger notifications can be obtained at <https://www.nhdfi.dncr.nh.gov/forest-protection/daily-fire-danger>.

As temperatures dip, residents should use caution when dumping their fireplace and woodstove ashes outside. Ensure that no hot coals or embers remain. Wet down ashes after dumping them. Dump ashes at least ten or more feet from any buildings.

Rental property owners are reminded that fire permits are issued to the person, not the property. Renters will need written permission of the property owner to kindle fires on the property being rented. The renter will need to obtain a fire permit for the period in which they are renting the property.
