The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: On the LRPC delegate, Ms. Ashjian reports that she is trying to find someone to take it on and will keep us posted. I've sent follow-up letters to the possible heirs of the Saint Moritz property advising them of the need to address the required documentation and the possible timeline they are facing. Alison has placed the advert for the hearings and Ashely is pulling together the owed amounts for the hearing. I've followed up with Don Berry on possibly taking the proposed conservation lands we have slotted for retention under their wing. I've pulled the property record card for the lot adjacent to the Lee Rd. property that we discussed might be merged into the Town tax deeded lot. The card shows that it is owned by – and provides the septic lot for – the Woodshed. I'm confirming a report that the tax deed lot may have elevated ground water which would make it unsuitable for a cemetery, but we will report back at the first public hearing on the proposed sales. Budget reviews continued along with exchanging several memos with the CIPC Chair to make sure they knew where I was headed and had a chance to discuss the matter before it all goes to print. After consulting with Primex; they have advised that we would be well served to develop a formal policy of the use of the function hall for when non-town entities (such as the recent request for a wedding) use the facility. This has been moved on to Dan S. as Recreation is responsible for the actual programming of the facility. I sat in on the DPW Collective Bargaining. We have found a series of adjusting entries that should have been made on 06/30 which should restore the SB contingency to its full amount and cover the Function Hall ADA bathroom. I hope to have this in front of you on 01/02.

Finance: This past week I met with the Bank of NH to discuss the investment fund and the lack of interest we are currently receiving. They sent back some very interesting information which I will share after we meet with MVSB on the 27th. I began work on the budget process, giving input where necessary.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: This week the Land Use Office received 21 new applications for permits and processed 23 permit applications.

We have received one (1) more application than the prior week.

We have processed “0” more permits than the prior week.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew fixed lights the Function Hall and patched holes at the Public Safety Building. Batteries and wire were dropped off in New Hampton from the Transfer Station. Siding on the Town Hall was fixed. White board set up for the library. The rink was cleaned, and the Zamboni was used. Town buildings were treated with salt. The heat was reset at the library. Weekly building checks. Recyclables and trash collected. Water distributed throughout town. All walkways and crosswalks were treated after the winter storms.

Fleet: The mechanics repaired the Zamboni water tank issue. Truck 10 sander was adjusted. The facility audit was completed. Salt loaded into the salt shed. After the storm events various plows and sanders needed attention. Truck 2 broken wheel studs replaced hydro valve. Adjusted Eq. 22 tank. Replaced truck 24 front auger bearing and greased the adaptor. Truck 6 sander chain installed and repaired lines to transmission.

Highway: Truck 10 sander was calibrated. Roads town wide checked, plowed, treated and sanded. The sand building was filled, and salt was pushed up into the shed. Truck 24 sander was removed to be washed and put back in. Truck 7 cutting edge replaced. Waste oil was pumped. Union meeting. Greased truck 7 body. Gravel hauled to Bodge Hill Road to fix the wash outs.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 4 containers of construction and demolition = 24 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The compost pile was turned, 924 lbs. of wire were recycled, 2540 lbs. of wet cell batteries were recycled, and 16 cubic yards of foam were recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday 360, Tuesday 375, Friday 404, Saturday 354, Sunday 172 total vehicles served 1665=47 per hour.

When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood.
- Charcoal.
- Clean pallets.
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter).
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence).

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood.
- Construction/demolition debris.
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste.
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
