The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: Meet with Bay Sewer District, continuing warrant and general administration.

Finance: Business was as usual.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: Week of 01/20/25 - 01/24/25

This week the Land Use Office received 16 new applications for permits and issued 13 permit applications.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew checked and salted parking lots from the snowstorm, crosswalks and sidewalks cleared of snow. Heat in the buildings checked. Game boards were built for the Recreation Department. Ice rink maintenance continues clearing snow and running the Zamboni. Repairs at the Library and the Recreation Department. Weekly building checks continue, along with trash and recycle pick up. Drains treated at the Public Safety Building. Aquatherms checked of ice buildup and removed if needed. Paper products were distributed to town buildings.

Fleet: Wiring issue on Eq16 worked on, for the snow blower issue. Got Truck 3 running. Set up wing valves on truck 5. Pulled plow apart on truck 1 and replaced plow oil. Diagnosed plow pump issue on truck 11. New tires were put on the forklift at the Transfer Station. Plow covers put on truck 11, started preventive maintenance and diagnosed engine oil leaks. Paperwork was completed and truck 5 was set up.

Highway: The highway crew treated roads and cleaned snow drifts town wide after the storm throughout the week. Stripped truck 5 and put the box on. The sand building was filled and salt deliveries taken care of. Truck 2 was washed. Truck 6 was cleaned and greased.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 2 containers of construction and demolition = 12 tons. The brush pile was burned, 32 Freon containing units were recycled, 22 cubic yards of foam were recycled. Vehicle counts Monday CLOSED, Tuesday 342, Friday 356, Saturday 294, Sunday 205 total vehicles served 1198 = 44 per hour

Gravelle provide EMS stand-by coverage for Ice Racing on Lee Pond.

Burning Permits: Fire Permits for 2025 may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood.
- Charcoal.
- Clean pallets.
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter).
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence).

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood.
- Construction/demolition debris.
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste.
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
