The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: Additional – and hopefully final – revisions were made to the ATM Warrant coming out of the 01/30 Board meeting and a review of the warrant by Town Counsel. Follow-up on the Tax Deeded properties. The LRCT was not open to accepting the islands but did suggest we check with the Loon Society which we did and found none of them are considered to be nesting locations. The two potential “heirs” were giving reminders, and I connected with a number of parties about Bean Rd after reviewing the Kanasatka study. Given the public hearing on 02/06; I have pushed my request for a formal vote off to 02/20. As I’ve mentioned recent changes in the law will require a rework of your policy on such sales and I will try to have it ready for that night as well.

Finance: This past week I met with Recreation to go through transactions in the Revolving Fund. Some changes have been made in how funds are allocated. This should alleviate the need for weekly journal entries due to improper coding. I began the pre-review of warrant articles with the DRA. This process will continue next week.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: This week the Land Use Office received 29 new applications for permits and issued 23 permit applications.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew checked and salted parking lots from the snowstorms, crosswalks and sidewalks cleared of snow. Heat in the buildings checked. Ice rink maintenance continues clearing snow and running the Zamboni. Weekly building checks continue, along with trash and recycle pick up. Miscellaneous maintenance tasks at PSB (septic) and Library (hot water).

Fleet: Trk 11 replace vacuum pump, serp belt and pulleys, replaced rotted fuel line and PM-B. Trk 2 adjuster issue, plow frame issue, new front piston. Trk 9 replace sander hinge bolt and broken fittings, air leak. Trk 1 plow repair. Trk 10 diagnose air issue and hydraulic leak. Trk 7 lighting issues. Trk24 wiring issue, new swing piston. 15-C-1 mount/balance snow tires, reset TPMS. Assist with plowing facilities and roads. EQ14 starting issue, blown hydraulic lines.

Highway: The highway crew treated roads and cleaned snow drifts town wide after the storms throughout the week. The sand building was filled and salt deliveries taken care of. Plow edges replaced on Trk 24. Reset sanding/plowing equipment on Trk6. Washed trucks and equipment. Tree work/trimming on a few roads.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 5 tons, 4 containers of construction and demolition = 20 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned. Vehicle counts: Monday 238, Tuesday 211, Friday 336, Saturday 210, Sunday 160 total vehicles served 1154 = 33 vehicles per hour.

When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood.
- Charcoal.
- Clean pallets.
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter).
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence).

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood.
- Construction/demolition debris.
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste.
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
