The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### Administration & Finance

**SB Business/Workshop:** We will have roll plans for sections of Route 25 to discuss what might be realistic for study zones. Also, Dari will have an outline of discussion topics for those tasks we have suggested might be undertaken in-house. Pls see the memo(s) from Robin while the balance of the items will be conversational in an attempt to reach a consensus as to how to proceed.

**Weekly Activities:** I met with Chris T. and Dan S. to review potential placement and extension of the pathway within current funding and possible grants. We regroup on the 3<sup>rd</sup> to prepare to approach the SB. I met with Chris T. and Ken F. to review their draft comments of the CMA report and they have made further inquiries of CMA. Chris T. and Mike K. and I met to review the Draft of the facilities report. Each of these issues will have a regroup over the coming two weeks and I suspect it will be 03/20 before we can get it onto your agenda. Robin and I worked on survey questions for the SB in the run-up to the next steps in the process of recruiting your next TA. I followed up with numerous inquirers on the Tax Deeded lands. Work continued to finalize the Town Fellow application as well as outline how to best proceed to review the re-imagining of several reserve funds and the Branley report. I began an analysis of our overtime. While I will acknowledge that the winter does indeed drive much of our OT, I will note that the time period includes Sept./Oct./Nov. in reaching almost \$250,000 from 09/01 thru 02/15. To follow-up on the request that we post all SAU meetings on the “Town Calendar” we have taken an alternate step that we believe can – to some degree enhance communications with the community while avoiding the problematic issues it poses. Unfortunately the amount of real estate on our front page is not nearly what it once was with the rewrite the former TA did (although this now does conform to the ADA rules on accessibility) so we were not able to make it quite as prominent as we once did but I’ve had Alison add a direct link to the SAU at the bottom of the home page. By cc of the email I asked the SAU to provide a similar distinctive link to us as well. This is as much as I am comfortable in doing as they are not a Town Department (where we maintain the link to the relatively independent Library) and frankly – in my view - it does not serve the Town side of the house - nor its Select Board – well to give the impression that it is. They are a separate corporate body politic and keeping that distinction clear and front and center I do believe is a better approach.

**Finance:** This past week the Finance office welcomed a new accounting clerk. Training began with good results. The new reconciliation module has been implemented, and we are working to

perfect this area of software. This new module will greatly help to streamline bank statement reconciliation.

Quarterly financial reporting was delivered to the board along with the results and management response to the 2024 Audit.

The warrant articles were accepted by the DRA with minimal changes.

**Department of Public Works**

**Facilities/Grounds:** The facilities and grounds crew continue with the ice rink maintenance. Met with plumber for the library and contractor for the Function Hall. Sander and truck 4 cleaned and fixed. New countertop fixed for finance. Lights fixed at the library and met with Carter.

**Fleet:** Roads plowed after the storm event. Wood chip trailer loaded. Truck 11 shifting issue addressed and. Truck 7 road call for lost wing pin. Truck 6 coolant leak. Installed rear axle Car 162. Truck 1 removed the sander to adjust and clean. Parts ordered. Union negotiations. Equipment 16 charging issue and test sander amp draw in truck 1. Installed exhaust in car 162.

**Highway:** The highway crew plowed snow drifts and cleared the roads after the storm event. Snow was pushed back on roads throughout town. Roads sanded throughout town as needed. Cutting edge changed on truck 9 and 6.

**Transfer Station:** This week we shipped out 2 containers of construction and demolition = 10 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 5 tons, and 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons. The brush pile was burned, and 12 cubic yards of foam were recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday CLOSED, Tuesday 392, Friday 411, Saturday 373, Sunday 202 total vehicles served 1378 = 50 per hour.

**Materials Acceptable for Burning:**

- Campfire wood.
- Charcoal.
- Clean pallets.
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter).
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence).

**Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:**

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood.
- Construction/demolition debris.

- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste.
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
