The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

SB Business/Workshop Supplemental Information: Item VI A. This parcel has been removed from the list of those tax deeded parcels I was authorized to place for sale [See 01/30/25 memo; “Counsel advises that we could simply deed over this parcel to the owner of the adjoining property – without feeling any necessity to put it out for formal bids...”]. He further indicated that we could do for “... some modest sum”. “ in recognition that the owner had escaped taxes upon the parcel for these past ten or so years. The question now becomes to what extent - if any – you wish to do so. **The required motion therefore is:**

I move to authorize the Town Administrator to cause the preparation of the needed documents to transfer the ownership of the Tax Deed for Parcel 130-89 to the owners of Parcel 130-70 contingent upon a payment to the Town of the sum of ??????????????????.

Weekly Activities: I conferenced with Town Sawyer of Lakes Region Computer on upgrades he advises on our technology as part of my homework relating to re-imagining the Community Technology Fund. (A meeting with the gentleman recommended by the State on Information Technology re: Docuware had to be rescheduled.) The library will be working with DPW and Recreation re: their request to install a StoryWalk® along the lower, flat section of the Sutherland Park path that would be up from spring through fall. We envision the materials used to be wooden posts, plywood slanted tops with laminated book pages adhered to them. The posts would be off the trail enough to not impede walking along the path. We will give you (and the public) a formal presentation once it is fully fleshed out. I filed the complete and formal application for a Town Fellow (Projects are: a handbook for our many volunteers to cover such items as 91-A, get their minutes on the Web, how to do mass mailings, schedule meeting rooms and various other tasks, HR From Hiring to Annual Review, Review and Update our Human Services Guidelines and a Satisfaction Survey of basic services we have not done since 2008. I’ve begun to research a free – to us – web-based service where we could place all of our surplus for sale without requiring the kind of preparation and costs, we used to go through. I would ask that you do a bit of wandering through [Online Government Auctions of Government Surplus](#) | [Municibid](#) in preparation for the proposal

I will make to proceed with some on a trial basis before we consider making it a permanent part of the purchasing and disposal policy.

Finance: This past week Finance continued to work with the bank reconciliation module with great results. The Tax office is delivering the general fund account number to their online payment system and will begin fully work within the general fund. Completion of this will eliminate their clearing account. The snow hindered the meeting with the Trustees, but we will meet next week to discuss the audit findings.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew continue with the Ice Rink maintenance. Met with contractor regarding the function hall. The electric signs were picked up for election day. Snowbanks removed parking lots cleared. Cabinets moved the Highway Garage office and shelving was reset. After the snow event roads were scraped and treated. The shop was cleaned. Library toilet repaired; shade installed for Carter. Truck 3 set up for the snow. Weekly building checks continue. Trash and recyclables picked up. Aquatherms checked. Propane tank readings. Water softeners checked and serviced. Ice melt was checked and delivered to all town buildings.

Fleet: The mechanics addressed truck 24 starting issue; battery cut off. Truck 6 regen issue. Car 151 preventative maintenance, and motor mount replaced. 15-r-3 replaced crankcase pressure sensor pigtail reset system. Union meeting. Truck 11 picked up from Irwin's. Car 151 dropped off and truck 10 sander repair. Truck 6 was unstuck on Avon Road. Eq 16 alternator replaced and greased. Truck 1 sander broom for Transfer Station and brought to the Transfer Station. The shop was cleaned. Snowstorms clean up.

Highway: The Highway Crew plowed and treated roads town wide after the storm events. Sand was hauled and mixed. The excavator was greased. Parts picked up from freightliner.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste=24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle=10 tons, 3 containers of construction and demolition=15 tons, 1 container of mixed scrap metal and 1 container of mixed electronics. The compost pile was turned, 631 pounds of non-ferrous metal and 605 pounds of wet cell batteries were recycled.

Vehicle counts: Monday 299, Tuesday 241, Friday 274, Saturday 284, Sunday 159 total vehicles served 1257= 35 per hour.

Operations: February 24: Tri-Town Training, Center Harbor, Sandwich, and Moultonborough firefighters met at the Public Safety Building for an emergency communications training exercise. Deputy Chief Houghton ran an exercise where firefighters were given an emergency incident shown on a video screen and had to manage the incident communications, giving assignments, and instructions to incoming unit while maintaining accountability of personnel operating at the scene. This exercise was designed to meet the requirements of NFPA 1710 and OSHA 1910.38. Chief Bengtson conducted an exercise with teams of two personnel separated and using radios to communicate how to build a LEGO toy, this exercise is designed to help firefighters relay critical information effectively. **February 25:** Rescue 3 was sent to DPW for repair of an electrical issue. Chief Bengtson provided a fire protection consultation for a new Whittier Highway business. Chief Bengtson participated in a Technical Review Committee meeting with the Town Planner for a proposed multi-family dwelling in the West Village Overlay District. **February 27:** Engine 1 was sent to Lakes Region Fire Apparatus for pump valve replacements.

Burning Permits: Fire Permits for 2025 may be obtained at the Public Safety Building located at 1035 Whittier Highway or online at www.NHFirePermit.com. Or a <https://nh.burnsafeamerica.com/>. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood.
- Charcoal.
- Clean pallets.
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter).
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence).

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood.
- Construction/demolition debris.
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste.
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
