The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### Administration & Finance

**SB Agenda/Workshop Items:** This section is for items not needing full memorandum or in need of supplemental comment.

Section VI. I. The question is whether or not you wish to extend the existing contract for one more year or bid the project out again. This decision could impact the start of the Pathway project.

**Weekly Activities:** Most activities were related to final preparations for the ATM, follow-up on the same (see memo to DHs), final preparation of the bid package for the Tax Deeded Lands and some editorial review of the TA search documents. I've received the updated price proposal for concrete work at States Landing and the chemical toilet system and am putting some final revisions touches on that bid package to be advertised on 03/27.

**Finance:** This past week Finance began discussions with MRI to change over the general ledger numbers to coincide with the Department of Revenue Administration. It will be a process that will greatly benefit all. When this transition is completed, we will begin transforming payroll to map the employees into the correct accounts. We are at the final stages with the Reconciliation module which enables a more professional reporting of the accounts. The Tax office has completed the last step to enable them to process directly into the general fund. I will say it is going seamlessly. Thank you to Ashley and her department for their support with this.

### **Department of Public Works**

**Facilities/Grounds:** The facilities and grounds crew treated the school and town buildings from the snow squall. The Public Safety building was set up for voting elections. The heat issue was addressed with Arrow Equipment at the Transfer Station as well as a heat issue at the library. Town meeting set up. Truck 11 cleaned. Fire extinguisher inspections throughout town. Weekly building checks, trash and recycle pick up. Water softeners checked; water delivered.

**Fleet:** The mechanics welded/repaired packer box #6 at the Transfer Station. Performed preventative maintenance on car 181. Road call to Eagle Shores for truck 20 blow hydraulic hose. Jib boom was taken apart to replace the hoses. Truck 24 no start condition and truck 1 stop light issue. Paperwork was completed.

**Highway:** The highway crew loaded the wood chip trailer. Trees were cleaned up from the winds and trimmed. Town roads were posted. Trucks washed and the shop was cleaned. The Chipper was greased. Gravel was added and spread with the grader on Bodge Hill Road , Ben Ayers Road, Blake Road and Lees Mills Road.

**Burning Permits:** The Lakes Region, including Moultonborough has been experiencing diminishing snow cover, a trend that raises concerns about increased the fire risk as the ground becomes exposed and the strong sun dries out the grass and leaves late in the winter and early spring. Without sufficient snow to act as a natural barrier, the potential for wildfires grows, making it essential to follow fire permit regulations. Residents are required to obtain a fire permit before kindling any fire or burning brush, except when the ground is fully covered with snow. This permit system not only ensures safe burning practices but also helps fire officials monitor and manage fire activity, reducing the likelihood of uncontrolled fires and protecting the state's natural resources. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time.

**Materials Acceptable for Burning:**

- Campfire wood
- Charcoal
- Clean pallets
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter)
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence)

**Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:**

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood
- Construction/demolition debris
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash
- Used oil and hazardous waste
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
