The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: Twas mostly follow-up on outstanding issues with respect to following up on questions raised by interested parties on the Tax Deed Sale notice that we had posted, follow-up on potential individuals for recruitment on the TA position, review of the second Draft of Staff comments on the CMA Transfer Station Study, and the like.

Finance: This past week Finance began reconciling additional asset accounts other than the operating account. We are making some headway; however this will be an ongoing practice until all accounts are complete.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: Facilities and grounds replaced valve for heating at the library. Filters replaced at the Town Hall. The catch basins were cleaned at States Landing. Supplies from Town Meeting put back. A dump run for the Town Hall was made as well as replacing air filters. Lakes Region HVAC at the Public Safety Building replaced filters. The bike path was cleared and opened

for the season. Weekly building checks continue. Trash and recycling picked up at town buildings and brought to the Transfer Station. Spring cleanup started at the playground. Drains treated at the Public Safety Building.

Fleet: Welded new panels on packer box #6. Preventative maintenance was performed on car 181 and car 223 was serviced and safety checked. Road call to Eagle Shores for a blown hydraulic hose on truck 20. The jib boom was taken apart to replace hoses. Truck 24 no start condition was addressed and truck 1 stop light issue.

Highway: The Highway crew checked roads and culverts throughout the town after the heavy rain. York raked dirt roads. Waste oil was pumped. Winter sand was pushed up and hauled from Robinsons pit. A visor was fabricated for the roller. The grader was washed and prepped for paint.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of construction and demolition = 36 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. Vehicle counts: Monday 245, Tuesday 303, Friday 283, Saturday 338, Sunday 237 = 1406 vehicles served, 40 vehicles per hour.

Burning Permits: The return of snow cover has temporarily negated the need for fire permits. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time. Residents are required to obtain a fire permit before kindling any fire or burning brush, except when the ground is fully covered with snow. This permit system not only ensures safe burning practices but also helps fire officials monitor and manage fire activity, reducing the likelihood of uncontrolled fires and protecting the state's natural resources.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood
- Charcoal
- Clean pallets
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter)
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence)

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood
- Construction/demolition debris
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash.
- Used oil and hazardous waste
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
