The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: We invited four area contractors to submit price proposals for the States Landing bath facility with a pre-bid meeting this Friday and bids due on the 10th. We are hopeful of having it on your agenda for the 15th. It is also posted on the web. Working w/Robin; I have made personal contacts with eleven people I have identified as having possible interest in a change in scenery from their current TA/TM position or direct interest specifically in Moultonborough. Tom Sawyer and I met with an AV consultant to determine how we might improve the televising of our meetings in the Meeting Room and – more specifically – feed our presentations directly into the stream so that person viewing it live or on demand can follow along. Tom S also worked with Consolidated/Fidium to develop pricing proposals for fiber into our various facilities. The monthly fee will be about \$700/mo *less* than what we pay Spectrum with the service considered superior. I attended (w/the Chair via Zoom) the Coalition Communities which the Chair will report on 04/01. I have scheduled a weekly meeting w/Land Use staff to review the status of permits and any outstanding citizen issues for every Tuesday at 2pm. Should you have comments or constituent concerns please try to get them to be by CoB Mondays so I can get them along to the Staff for review and response during these weekly meetings.

Finance: This past week the bank reconciliations began for accounts other than the operating account. One of the recreation accounts has been reconciled. Work is still being done on the investment and additional recreation account. The Tax clearing account should be integrated into the general fund this week, eliminating one of the two clearing accounts.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew picked up trash along the Long Island beach. The Ice Rink building was cleaned. The Transfer Station was laid out for the installation of the safety bars. Plow trucks prepared for the storm. Roads plowed and treated after the winter storm events. Parking lots, walkways and crosswalks plowed and treated. Weekly building checks, trash and recyclables picked up. Drains treated at the Public Safety Building. Water and paper products distributed.

Fleet: The mechanics continued to repair truck 20 boom hoses. Truck 24 seized sensor and oil pan. Equipment 39 hydraulic leak. Truck 11 sander harness repaired. Truck 2 reset back flow valves. Truck 7 checked for burning smell, spinner motor stuck. Scrapers were made for the roller. Equipment 17 was prepped for the season. Car 223 safety checked. Packer box #6 was repaired at the Transfer Station.

Highway: The highway crew checked, plowed, and treated the roads town wide after the winter storm events. The grader was painted, the shop cleaned. Waste oil was pumped. Sand/salt was mixed and pushed up in the shed. Winter sand was hauled to the shop. The rear window was fabricated for the roller. Trucks were washed. The loader was greased.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 1 container of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle=5 tons, 3 containers of construction and demolition=15 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The compost pile was turned, and the brush pile was burned. Vehicle counts: Monday 116, Tuesday 280, Friday 478, Saturday 125, Sunday 175 total vehicles served 1174= 33 vehicles per hour.

Burning Permits: The return of snow cover has temporarily negated the need for fire permits. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time. Residents are required to obtain a fire permit before kindling any fire or burning brush, except when the ground is fully covered with snow. This permit system not only ensures safe burning practices but also helps fire officials monitor and manage fire activity, reducing the likelihood of uncontrolled fires and protecting the state's natural resources.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood
- Charcoal
- Clean pallets
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter)
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence)

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood
- Construction/demolition debris
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash
- Used oil and hazardous waste
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
