The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: Subject to comment; It is my intent to televise bid openings – whenever it is practicable – with all bids after we complete the opening for the States Landing Bathroom Facility (the room was already reserved). This may require we modify our normal bid opening time to one least likely to have conflicts with scheduled meetings. Please advise ASAP if you have any concerns, together with what those might be, but... in this day of “transparency” being an oft used word for citizen awareness, I can’t think of an action more in keeping with that drive. We answered continuing questions on the land sales and began revisions to various SB policies for your consideration in an effort to conform them with the revised TA job description. We have received one specific referral from MMANH on the Fellow program and are working to see if we can fit him into some of our projects, especially given his geography (Somersworth). UNH and MMANH have asked if we might split up the projects and possibly be open to more than one Fellow to which I have responded in the affirmative at this point. As we have discussed, all that seems to be a barrier for us is geography but... We shall hope for the best. I had my Land Use meeting where we set some specific goals for the coming two-week period. I’ll give you a more in-depth report after the next meeting. We drafted an Org Chart I believe reflects the TA job description and provides a clear sense of which department provides administrative support to which Board or Committee. [A big thanks to Alanna who dealt with me editing and editing and editing 😊]. Robin will review that with the DHs and we will try to have it before you on 04/15. Upon my return we will begin to draft the changes to various policies we believe align them with your actions on the job description. I personally don’t see any big changes but would classify them as clarifications for the record.

We also recently processed a citizen's request for 2,154 pages of public records. Every page had to be reviewed by the Clerk's office prior to disclosure to ensure compliance with privacy laws.

Does your dog need their rabies vaccination between now and the dog licensing deadline?

The Town Clerk's office and the NH Humane Society are working together to provide a low-cost rabies and dog license clinic on Saturday, April 19th from 11:00am – 3:00pm right at the Town Hall. For just \$25 per pet, you can get your dog vaccinated against rabies and then visit the Town Clerk's office immediately afterward to license them (licensing fees below). During the rabies clinic, the clerk's office will be open for **dog licensing purposes only**.

Dog license fees are as follows:

- \$3.00 for the first dog owned by someone age 65 or older
- \$7.50 for all spayed/neutered dogs and puppies under 7 months of age
- \$10.00 for any unaltered dogs

The clerk's office accepts cash, checks, and credit/debit cards (with a 3% convenience fee).

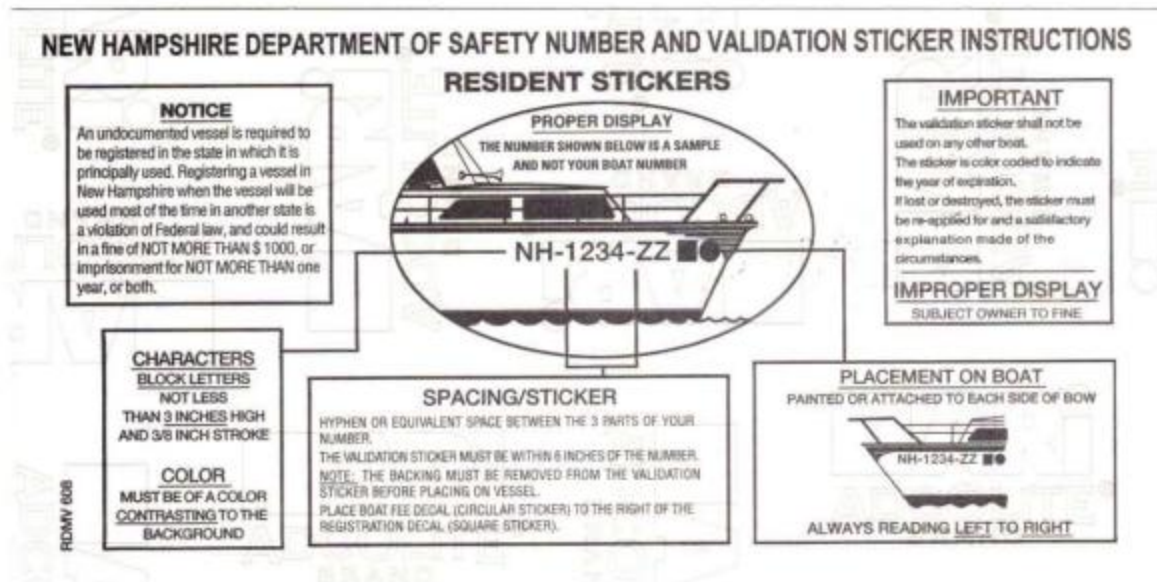

Boat Decals - The Moultonborough Town Clerk's office can now process boat registration renewals for the 2025 season. **To renew with us, please provide the following:**

- The government-issued photo ID of the person coming in to renew.
- One of the following:
 - The boat renewal letter from the NH DMV (add \$5 per boat to the amount due on the letter), signed by the primary owner.
 - Last year's registration, signed by the primary owner.
 - A completed and signed [Boat Registration Application](#).
- Payment. There is a \$5 boat agent fee added to all boat registrations that are processed by any town or marina.
 - Registering your boat in Moultonborough allows the town to keep more than just the agent fee, ensuring that more of your money stays local.
 - We can accept cash, checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, or cards (there is a 3% convenience fee added by your credit card company to all card transactions).

Due to a federal law, this year the New Hampshire DMV was required to redesign their boat decal system. You may notice that there will now be two sets of decals issued at the time of registration: one set of circular decals and one set of the familiar square decals that boat owners are used to.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The Facilities and Grounds crew picked up trash at Long Island Beach. Plowed and treated roads and parking lots after the snowstorm events, along with clearing and treating walkways. The Ice Rink buildings were cleaned. The layout of the Transfer Station was done for the Safety Bar installations. Weekly building checks continue along with trash and recycle pick up. Drains treated at the Public Safety Building. Paper products and water delivered to town buildings as needed.

Fleet: The mechanics worked on Truck 9 and 24 repairing their no start issue. Truck 24 and 10 sander bearings. Truck 24 & 20 built hoses. The mechanics assisted with the winter storm clean up. Truck 1 ABS sensor was repaired, and the shop was cleaned.

Highway: The Highway crew checked, plowed, and treated roads. Firewood was cut. Sand was hauled from Robinsons pit to the shop. Parts picked up in Concord.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycling = 10 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition = 40 tons. The brush pile was burned, and the compost pile was turned. 24 cubic yards of foam were recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday 252, Tuesday 332, Friday 347, Saturday 328, Sunday 192 total vehicles served 1451 = 41 vehicles per hour.

Burning Permits: The return of snow cover has temporarily negated the need for fire permits. When the ground is covered with snow, no fire permits are required, and you may burn at any time. Residents are required to obtain a fire permit before kindling any fire or burning brush, except when the ground is fully covered with snow. This permit system not only ensures safe burning practices but also helps fire officials monitor and manage fire activity, reducing the likelihood of uncontrolled fires and protecting the state's natural resources.

Materials Acceptable for Burning:

- Campfire wood
- Charcoal

- Clean pallets
- Brush (<5 inches in diameter)
- Clean lumber scraps (homeowner, at primary residence)

Material That Are Prohibited and May Not Be Burned:

- Plywood and painted, stained, glued or otherwise pressure treated wood
- Construction/demolition debris
- Tires and plastics
- Household trash
- Used oil and hazardous waste
- Plastic- or wax-coated paper or cardboard, and magazines
