The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### **Administration & Finance**

**Finance:** This past week the finance office processed payroll along with processing a small amount of accounts payable and still making headway on the reconciliation module.

### **Department of Public Works**

**Facilities/Grounds:** The facilities and grounds crew removed the tree at the Recreation Department and the old debris from the garden at the Function Hall. Flags and banners were put up in town. The new Recreation Department letters hung on the building. Gravel Parking lots repaired. Interview for the Part-Time position. Toilets at the Function Hall repair. The well was installed at Middle Neck. Meetings with pest control and historical committee. The leaky mixing valve at the Public Safety building was repaired. Weekly building checks, trash and recycling continues. Bathrooms cleaned at the playground. Taylor property, Middle Neck, Sutherland Park, Function Hall, and Mason cemeteries cut and trimmed. Water distributed to town buildings. States Landing, Birch Hill, Richardson, Vickery, Clement, Holland Hill and Friese cleaned up. Town Hall, Long Island and Lees Mill Landing cleaned.

**Fleet:** The mechanics checked out the DEF system in 15-E at the Neck Station. Tested boom on Truck 20, verify operation on test run. Set up Truck 2 and preventative maintenance. Invoices completed. Serviced car 161 reset brake calipers and lights. Engine light issue addressed in 15-E-4. Reset Truck 9 systems and coolant system. Eq 25 broom looked at, Eq 35 filters and Eq 58 replaced broom wafers. Eq 23 drive train, Eq 12 warranty work and 15-E-4 road tested, reset system. Wood chip trailer loaded. Bids worked on for lift. Car 161 state inspection and plates installed. Paperwork completed. Truck 2 washes and undercoated. Car 162 mirror replaced, wiring cleaned up and rear brakes. The shop was cleaned up.

**Highway:** The Highway crew checked roads from the weekend storms. Ditching on Red Hill and Lakeshore. Graveled the playground parking lot. Rocks dug for ditching on Red Hill Road. Lakeshore Drive was paved by GMI. The crew attended the Mountain of Demos in Sunapee. Equipment washed. A employees attended the NRRA conference for Solid Wate Operator training. Material was hauled to the shop. Culverts were checked throughout town. The bike path was swept. Grader ditching on Evans Road, Randall, Red Hill, Old Red Hill and Harvard.

**Transfer Station:** This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 12 containers of construction and demolition = 60 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The compost pile was turned, and the brush pile was burned. Vehicle counts : Monday CLOSED TRAINING, Tuesday 717, Friday 676, Saturday 640, Sunday 448 total 2481 = 90 vehicles per hour.

### **Call Staff Participation:**

Call firefighters responded to seven incidents, providing an average of 2.6 firefighters per incident.

### **Inspections:**

- LP Above Ground Tanks & Piping: 3 inspections conducted.

**Operations:** 5/22 Firefighters Cavic and Eldridge gave a presentation on high performance CPR and review of the Zoll Autopluse. The ZOLL AutoPulse is an automated chest compression system designed to provide high-quality CPR in emergency situations. Unlike traditional manual CPR, the AutoPulse uses a load-distributing LifeBand to squeeze the entire chest, ensuring consistent and effective compressions. This device is battery-operated and helps maintain uninterrupted blood flow, even during patient transport, which can improve survival rates for cardiac arrest victims. It is particularly useful for EMS professionals who need to perform CPR in challenging environments.

5/23 Deputy Houghton and Chief Bengtson conducted VENT, Enter, Isolate, Search (VEIS) training with the duty crew. VEIS training is a critical skill for conducting searches and rescuing victims in burning buildings. Being proficient at this skill allows firefighters to locate victims trapped in rooms, and remove them quickly, increasing survival chances. Using masks that have been obscured, firefighters entered the room, located the interior door, checked for victims in the hallway, closed the door, located the victim and removed them.

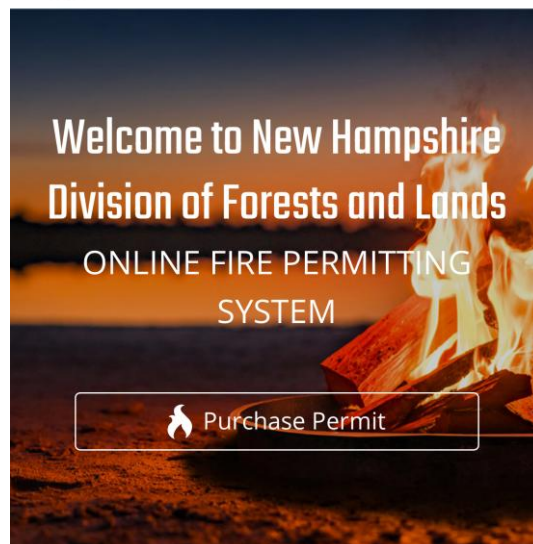

Emergencies happen when we least expect them, and staying informed is the key to keeping your family safe. The Town of Moultonborough offers real-time emergency alerts via text, email, pager, or even voice calls in extreme situations—so you’re never left in the dark when it matters most.

With many households moving away from traditional landlines, registering your contact information ensures you receive crucial updates when they happen. Whether it's an emergency evacuation, shelter-in-place order, boil water advisory, or major transportation disruptions, this system will provide timely notifications to help you respond effectively.

Signing up is easy and free—don't wait until disaster strikes. Be proactive and stay connected to vital updates today!

The system is intended to be used for emergency alerts, as well as non-emergency incidents that may have significant impacts on residents. Emergency Alerts could be related to specific hazards that require some kind of action be taken such as evacuation, shelter in place, boil water orders, etc. Non-emergency alerts could include significant transportation problems with prolonged impacts or significant ongoing police or fire activity. This list is not meant to be all inclusive and demonstrates that this system will not be used for routine information. In addition to receiving information on your wireless device, you may also receive notification on your land telephone line (if you have one) depending on the type of incident or event.
