The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: Unfortunately, we have to report that 3 high bidders on the 2017 Ford Escape Interceptor have failed to close and Municibid recommends that we relist it. We did that for 2 weeks with a closing date of June 23, 2025. We are ever so slowly moving the Tax Deed closing forward. One of our recent hirers declined the final offer because it took too long. In the midst of revising procedure to address. We are in the process of exploring the use of THS Artificial Intelligence to produce minutes. There were a few hiccups with the first set of minutes but hoping with continued use that this can improve and we may be able to utilize it for more meetings in the future.

Finance: This past week I attended a Right To Know seminar which was very informative. I met with Bob Waldron from the Trustee of Trust Funds to discuss systems to streamline the accounting procedures and I went to a webinar for NHRS to learn the new procedures for adding new employees. Payroll and partial AP was processed.

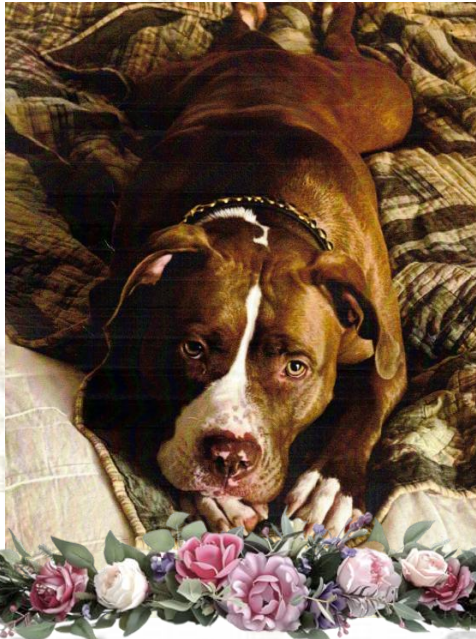

checks, and assisted new residents with establishing residency, among other services. Town Clerk Julia Marchand and Deputy Town Clerk Jennifer Boyll attended a regional workshop along with many other clerks and their staff from around the Lakes Region and White Mountains area, where representatives from the NH City & Town Clerks Association, DMV, Vital Records Division, and Secretary of State's office went over updated laws, guidelines, and procedures.

Dogs – The statutory deadline for dog licensing was Wednesday, April 30th, 2025. All dogs that were licensed prior to May 1st, 2025, have been automatically entered into the Top Dog Contest. You can still license your dog in the month of June with minimal late fees to avoid a civil forfeiture fine! By Monday, May 12th, contact attempts had been completed for all owners of unlicensed dogs. A late fee of \$1 per month late has been applied to each late dog license. These \$1 late fees will accumulate each month until the license is renewed. In July, a civil forfeiture fine of \$25 will be applied to each outstanding dog license and will be delivered to the owner by the Police Department.

Please license your dog ASAP to reduce these fees and avoid fines or notify the Town Clerk's office if you no longer own your dog!

If your dog has received a rabies vaccination since the last time they were licensed, please be sure to send a copy to the Town Clerk's office to ensure our records are up to date. If our system shows your dog as having an expired rabies vaccination, you will not be able to renew the license until proof of a current rabies vaccination is shown.

The clerk's office accepts cash, checks, and credit/debit cards (with a 3% convenience fee).

Did you know? The Town Clerk's office is now authorized to issue standard Veteran plates! Veterans will no longer need to wait in line at the DMV to receive regular Veteran plates – just bring your DD214 or other proof of honorable discharge along with a valid government-issued photo ID and any registration paperwork for new or renewal registrations. Please contact our office before coming in to ensure you have what you need.

Boat Decals - The Moultonborough Town Clerk's office has boat decals in stock and is ready to process boat registrations for the 2025 season. **To renew with us, please provide the following:**

- The government-issued photo ID of the person coming in to renew.
- One of the following:
 - The boat renewal letter from the NH DMV (add \$5 per boat to the amount due on the letter), signed by the primary owner.
 - Last year's registration, signed by the primary owner.
 - A completed and signed [Boat Registration Application](#).
- Payment. There is a \$5 boat agent fee added to all boat registrations that are processed by any town or marina.
 - Registering your boat in Moultonborough allows the town to keep more than just the agent fee, ensuring that more of your money stays local.
 - We can accept cash, checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, or cards (there is a 3% convenience fee added by your credit card company to all card transactions).

Due to a federal law, this year the New Hampshire DMV was required to redesign their boat decal system. You may notice that there will now be two sets of decals issued at the time of registration: one set of circular decals and one set of the familiar square decals that boat owners are used to.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facility and grounds crew opened and closed a full burial at Middle Neck Cemetery. The playground courts were cleaned. Opened and closed cremation burials. Picnic tables were set at the playground. Boiler inspections completed. Lines marked for parking at the playground. Mowed and marked lines at the Transfer Station. Weekly building checks continue. Mowing and trimming throughout town. Trash and recyclables collected.

Fleet: The mechanics replaced def sender and pump in 15-E-3 and preventative maintenance. Facility audit and work repair orders completed. Checked Eq 16 air conditioner system. Clean the condenser and recharge eq13 tires. First 500-hour service on Eq25 repaired and greased fitting port on tilt arm and blew out radiators. The wood chip trailer was loaded. New tires on the 6-ton trailer, service, fix lights and safety check. Car 162 service, changed tire, safety check and fixed a few bad spots on the body.

Highway: The highway crew cleaned bever culverts and sprayed for poison ivy. Grading, shouldering, and ditching continues. Rocks removed from roadways. The union meeting was held on Friday. Styrofoam was delivered to Gilford.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 1 container of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 1 container of single stream recycling = 5 tons and 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. The compost pile was turned, and the brush pile was burned.

Chief Plaisted was the Town's first full-time fire chief, serving from 1994 to his retirement in 2004. He served the community for over 30 years in many capacities with scouting, senior meals, and the historical society.

What is a Category 1 fire?

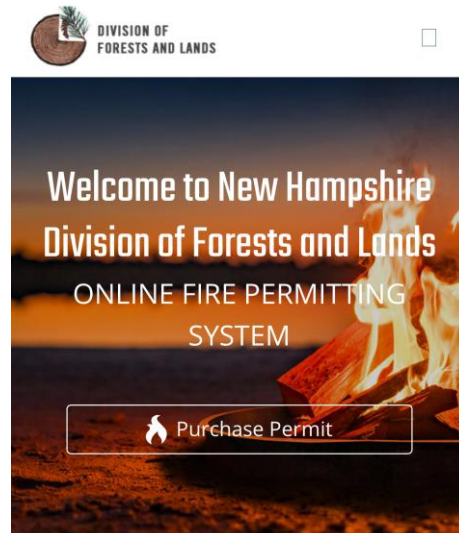
"Category 1 Fire" means a small, controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 25 feet from structures.

A Category 1 fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit at any time or day whether it is raining or not.

**The Town of Moultonborough Alerts!**

Emergencies happen when we least expect them, and staying informed is the key to keeping your family safe. The Town of Moultonborough offers real-time emergency alerts via text, email, pager, or even voice calls in extreme situations—so you are never left in the dark when it matters most.

With many households moving away from traditional landlines, registering your contact information ensures you receive crucial updates when they happen. Whether it is an emergency evacuation, shelter-in-place order, boil water advisory, or major transportation disruptions, this system will provide timely notifications to help you respond effectively.

Signing up is easy and free—do not wait until disaster strikes. Be proactive and stay connected to vital updates today!

The system is intended to be used for emergency alerts, as well as non-emergency incidents that may have significant impacts on residents. Emergency Alerts could be related to specific hazards that require some kind of action be taken such as evacuation, shelter in place, boil water orders, etc. Non-emergency alerts could include significant transportation problems with prolonged impacts or significant ongoing police or fire activity. This list is not meant to be all inclusive and demonstrates that this system will not be used for routine information. In addition to receiving information on your wireless device, you may also receive notification on your land telephone line (if you have one) depending on the type of incident or event.
