The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Activities: We continue to grind out the land sales and have sent an apology/explanation letter to all bidders. The second round of sales for the Fire Chief's car has been concluded after the initial group of bidders failed to complete their purchases. While the winning bid was not quite as high, it was successful in the range of \$4,300. I remain convinced that the lower cost and ease of advertising and the ability to do one-off sales as surplus once so declared make this a very viable means of disposing of such property. Our fellow has done his initial research on the Volunteer handbook and now begins a series of attending meetings of various Boards and Commissions. He has almost completed the rounds of the Department Heads and is closing in on the first draft of a new performance tool.

Finance: This past week I had multiple meetings with MTS to discuss payroll/budgeting/statement recon/GL. The process of changing is intricate, and this is just the beginning. When changes are completed the finance process will be streamlined, creating a cohesive balance between the Town's financial information, our auditors and DRA documentation.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: This past week the facilities and grounds crew raked and cleaned the beaches. Installed a new water shut off at the Recreation Department. A metal gazebo was built at the playground. Pickleball and tennis courts cleaned. Weekly building checks, trash and recycling collected. Mowing and trimming throughout town buildings and cemeteries. Water softeners placed in the Public Safety Building, Transfer Station, and the Function Hall.

Fleet: The mechanics performed DEF service and preventative maintenance on truck 3. Preventative maintenance in Car 182 and replaced lower control arm bushing. Inspection for 15-

F-2 and replaced door weather strip. The wood chip trailer was loaded. Quick valves replaced and the tarp in truck 10. Brake issue addressed in Equipment 14. State inspection on cars 223 and 181. New deck belt on Ferris 700.

Highway: The highway crew cut trees and Site work at States Landing for the pavilion. Fill was hauled to Ossipee Mountain Road. Stone was put for the foundation. Brush was chipped. Culvert was placed in at States landing. Trucks were washed.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 4 containers of municipal solid waste=48 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle=15 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition=40 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. 13 cubic yards of foam were recycled, the brush pile was burned, and the compost pile was turned. Vehicle counts: Monday 493, Tuesday 467, Friday 784, Saturday 445, Sunday 514 total 2703 residents served= 76 residents per hour.

Burning Permits:

What is a Category 1 fire?


"Category I Fire" means a small, controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 25 feet from structures.

A Category I fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit at any time or day whether it is raining or not.

Fireworks

Statewide Rules:

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 21 years old to purchase, possess, or use fireworks.
- Where You Can Use Them: Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with the landowner's written permission or presence. Town beaches, parks, and boat launches are off-limits.
- Types Allowed: Legal fireworks include items like fountains, roman candles, sparklers, ground spinners, and reloadable mortars. High-powered explosives like M-80s, cherry bombs, and large aerial shells are illegal and prohibited.
- Retail Sales: Fireworks must be purchased from licensed New Hampshire retailers. Bringing fireworks in from out of state is prohibited.

Town Restrictions:

Town Ordinance limits the use of "consumer fireworks" to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.

Liability:

People displaying can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property. In other words, you can be sued for using fireworks and sparks, ember and debris falling onto property that isn't yours.

Emergencies happen when we least expect them, and staying informed is the key to keeping your family safe. The Town of Moultonborough offers real-time emergency alerts via text, email, pager, or even voice calls in extreme situations—so you are never left in the dark when it matters most.

With many households moving away from traditional landlines, registering your contact information ensures you receive crucial updates when they happen. Whether it is an emergency evacuation, shelter-in-place order, boil water advisory, or major transportation disruptions, this system will provide timely notifications to help you respond effectively.

Signing up is easy and free—do not wait until disaster strikes. Be proactive and stay connected to vital updates today!

The system is intended to be used for emergency alerts, as well as non-emergency incidents that may have significant impacts on residents. Emergency Alerts could be related to specific hazards that require some kind of action be taken such as evacuation, shelter in place, boil water orders, etc. Non-emergency alerts could include significant transportation problems with prolonged impacts or significant ongoing police or fire activity. This list is not meant to be all inclusive and demonstrates that this system will not be used for routine information. In addition to receiving information on your wireless device, you may also receive notification on your land telephone line (if you have one) depending on the type of incident or event.
