The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Update: As expected, my first week as Town Administrator has been fast-paced and filled with meaningful engagement across town operations. I spent a good portion of the week working with the Interim Town Administrator on transitional matters to ensure continuity and clarity and I am grateful for their support during this transition. I connected with all Department Managers to establish a foundation for ongoing collaboration and continued progress on personnel-related matters. Throughout the week, I supported various departments with customer service and internal process discussions, reviewed active projects, and addressed staffing - maintaining steady communication with department heads. We plan to gather in person as a team in the near future. Daily responsibilities included staff communication, responding to public inquiries, and supporting our team. I'm grateful for the warm welcome and look forward to strengthening our partnerships as we move forward.

Finance: Working on Payroll and Year End.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew blew off the pickleball court and walking path. Town beaches cleaned. Building checks continue. Trash and recyclables picked up. Mowing and trimming throughout town properties and cemeteries.

Fleet: The mechanics adjusted a/c belt on equipment 39. Replaced hose bracket on grading bucket. Diagnosed Car 151 02 sensor. The wood chip trailer was loaded. Paperwork for state inspection. Facility audit. Car 161 state inspection, Car 223 and 15-F-1 preventative maintenance. Paperwork and invoices entered. Truck 9 hydraulic leak. Rewired and replaced bed lights. Truck 7 rewire and replace back up alarm.

Highway: The highway crew watered Glidden Road, Lees Mill, Blake, and ditched Kona. Prep work for paving. Sink hole repaired. The transfer station culvert was replaced. Ledge pack from

Robinsons pit picked up, asphalt picked up from Pike Industries. Shimmied Hayes Lane. The bike path was swept.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 4 containers of municipal solid waste = 48 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycling = 15 tons, 9 containers of construction and demolition = 45 tons and 2 containers of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, the compost pile was turned, 24 cubic yards of foam were recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday 709, Tuesday 647, Friday 962, Saturday 560, Sunday 348 total vehicles served 3226 = 91 per hour.

Operations:

7/23 Moultonborough firefighters were dispatched to Tamworth for a building fire at the Pinetree Power Plant to function as the rapid intervention team. The purpose and function of Rapid Intervention Teams (RITs) on the fireground is to provide a dedicated, fully equipped team of firefighters whose sole responsibility is to perform immediate rescue operations for trapped, lost, injured, or distressed firefighters during emergency incidents. Due to the extreme heat both inside and outside of the plant, combined with the extended nature of the incident RIT was needed. After the incident was upgraded to multiple alarms, Moultonborough's firefighters were integrated into fire extinguishment operations until released by command after being on scene for four hours.



7/24 Moultonborough firefighters and Police participated in Moultonborough Recreation Departments Annual Touch-a-Truck program with the Lt. Gravelle, firefighters Driscoll, Manville, and O'Neil showing campers Engine 4 and its equipment. Chief Bengtson spoke briefly about the truck and its capabilities.



Burning Permits:

What is a Category 1 fire?

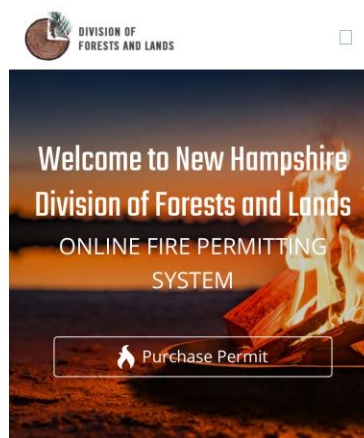
"Category 1 Fire" means a small, controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 25 feet from structures.

A Category 1 fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit at any time or day whether it is raining or not.



How to obtain a fire permit:

Fireworks:

Statewide Rules:

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 21 years old to purchase, possess, or use fireworks.
- Where You Can Use Them: Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with the landowner's written permission or presence. Town beaches, parks, and boat launches are off-limits.
- Types Allowed: Legal fireworks include items like fountains, roman candles, sparklers, ground spinners, and reloadable mortars. High-powered explosives like M-80s, cherry bombs, and large aerial shells are illegal and prohibited.
- Retail Sales: Fireworks must be purchased from licensed New Hampshire retailers. Bringing fireworks in from out of state is prohibited.

Town Restrictions:

Town Ordinance limits the use of "consumer fireworks" to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.

Liability:

People displaying can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property. In other words, you can be sued for using fireworks and sparks, embers and debris falling onto property that is not yours.

Emergencies happen when we least expect them, and staying informed is the key to keeping your family safe. The Town of Moultonborough offers real-time emergency alerts via text, email, pager, or even voice calls in extreme situations—so you are never left in the dark when it matters most.

With many households moving away from traditional landlines, registering your contact information ensures you receive crucial updates when they happen. Whether it is an emergency evacuation, shelter-in-place order, boil water advisory, or major transportation disruptions, this system will provide timely notifications to help you respond effectively.

Signing up is easy and free—do not wait until disaster strikes. Be proactive and stay connected to vital updates today!

The system is intended to be used for emergency alerts, as well as non-emergency incidents that may have significant impacts on residents. Emergency Alerts could be related to specific hazards that require some kind of action be taken such as evacuation, shelter in place, boil water orders, etc. Non-emergency alerts could include significant transportation problems with prolonged impacts or significant ongoing police or fire activity. This list is not meant to be all inclusive and demonstrates that this system will not be used for routine information. In addition to receiving information on your wireless device, you may also receive notification on your land telephone line (if you have one) depending on the type of incident or event.
