The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Update: This past week was busy and productive. I met with a few residents to hear their feedback and share updates, worked closely with the Finance Director on budget planning and supported her ongoing financial clean-up efforts that she has been focused on. I spent time reviewing how certain issues have been handled in the past to help guide current decision making. I officially joined the Municipal Management Association of New Hampshire, which is already proving to be an extremely valuable resource. A highlight of the week was our department manager's meeting it was a great chance to connect, share ideas, and discuss various items. I continue to handle daily tasks and decisions as they came in. The calendar is moving way too fast!

Finance: Worked on reconciliation and year end.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: Week of 8/18/2025 - 8/22/2025

This week the Land Use Office received (15) new applications for permits and issued (34) permit applications. In addition, the Code Enforcement Office received (3) citizen complaints and resolved (1) open complaints and conducted (26) Inspections related to building construction and complaint investigations.

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew collected trash and recyclables from town buildings. The Pickleball court and beaches were cleaned. Mowing and trimming continues throughout town buildings and cemeteries. The Town Hall islands were maintained. The Taylor Property was cleaned.

Fleet: 15-R-3 turbo was worked on and found exhaust leak. Truck 15 dead battery replaced. Truck 3 sensor in on DEF. Road call for truck 7 for a flat tire and brakes rebuilt. Equipment 16 release pins on bucket repaired as well as broken water supply. Tools picked up and parts runs. A new belt was put into the zero-turn lawn mower and rebuilt the drive pully system.

Highway: The highway crew ditched and shouldered on the east side of town, Bodge Hill Road, Randall Road, Evans, Severance, Clarks, Blacks Landing and States Landing. Clear cut trees at fire hydrant and dead tree on the side of the road.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycling = 15 tons, 9 containers of construction and demolition = 45 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. There was no brush burning due to the high fire danger. 40 Freon containing devices were recycled and 18 cubic yards of foam were recycled. The compost pile was turned. Vehicle counts: Monday 819, Tuesday 453, Friday 678, Saturday 631, Sunday 714 total vehicles served 3295=93 per hour.

Operations:

- 8/19 The fire chief participated in a TRC review with the Code Enforcement Officer, Interim Town Planner, and Land Use Technician of a subdivision proposed for Portage Pass.
- 8/20 Firefighters from the Moultonborough, Center Harbor, and Sandwich Fire Departments recently toured the 603 Oil and Propane facility as part of ongoing training efforts. During the visit, crews reviewed the company's oil and propane delivery trucks, examined critical safety features, and gained insight into the layout of storage tanks and related equipment.

These tours play a vital role in enhancing firefighter readiness by helping personnel identify potential hazards, locate water sources, and plan safe apparatus access in the event of an emergency. In addition, firefighters become familiar with delivery truck operations and emergency shutoff procedures. This knowledge is essential for effectively managing leaks, fires, or other incidents. This proactive approach supports the safety of the public, first responders, and the environment, reinforcing the department's commitment to preparing for low-frequency, high-risk situations. Burning Permits : ***What is a Category 1 fire?***

"Category I Fire" means a small, controlled fire, such as a camp or cooking fire, no greater than 2 feet in diameter contained within a ring of fire resistive material or in a portable fireplace, except for public & private campgrounds or picnic sites, located at least 25 feet from structures.

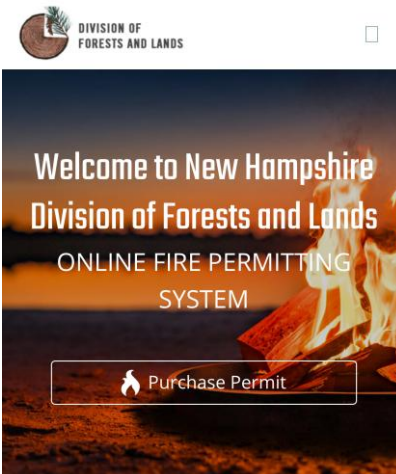
A Category I fire, conditions permitting, may be kindled with a permit at any time or day whether it is raining or not.



How to obtain a fire permit:

Due to the High – Very High Fire Danger the Online Fire Permit has been shut off. Fire Permits must be obtained at the Public Safety Building.

Fire Danger:

Due to a lack of widespread rainfall, the Moultonborough area and the Lakes Region of New Hampshire are experiencing increasingly dry conditions that can lead to the easy ignition and rapid spread of fire. As a result, the New Hampshire Forest Rangers have declared Fire Danger levels from HIGH to VERY HIGH for most of the state. Residents and visitors are urged to use extreme caution with any outdoor burning or fire-related activities. However, fires are still permitted.

Fireworks:**Statewide Rules:**

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 21 years old to purchase, possess, or use fireworks.
- Where You Can Use Them: Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with the landowner's written permission or presence. Town beaches, parks, and boat launches are off-limits.
- Types Allowed: Legal fireworks include items like fountains, roman candles, sparklers, ground spinners, and reloadable mortars. High-powered explosives like M-80s, cherry bombs, and large aerial shells are illegal and prohibited.
- Retail Sales: Fireworks must be purchased from licensed New Hampshire retailers. Bringing fireworks in from out of state is prohibited.

Town Restrictions:

Town Ordinance limits the use of "consumer fireworks" to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.

Liability:

People displaying can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property. In other words, you can be sued for using fireworks and sparks, embers and debris falling onto property that is not yours. With Very High Fire Danger conditions, use of fireworks is not recommended.

Emergencies can strike without warning—and when they do, having accurate, timely information is critical. That is why the Town of Moultonborough offers a reliable emergency alert system that keeps you connected when it matters most.

This system delivers real-time notifications straight to your phone, email, pager, or even via voice call in urgent situations. Whether it is a shelter-in-place order, evacuation notice, boil water advisory, or a significant traffic disruption, you will receive the updates you need to make informed decisions and protect your loved ones.

As more households move away from traditional landlines, it is more important than ever to register your current contact information. Signing up is easy, free, and ensures you will not miss critical alerts—emergency or otherwise.

In addition to urgent situations, the system may also provide non-emergency alerts about significant police or fire activity, or other events that could impact your daily life. Routine information will not be sent—only messages that truly matter.
