The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Update: Last week, budget season officially kicked off with memos, timelines and worksheets sent to all department managers, due by October 3. Town employees participated in harassment prevention training led by Primex, our risk management partner. The Capital Improvements Planning Committee (CIPC) meets this week (9/18/25 at 1pm), and interviews were conducted by two Selectmen and two School Board members for Advisory Budget Committee vacancies, with a recommendation expected at the October 7th Selectmen's meeting. I'm continuing to work on my budget and daily operations, while also picking up DPW and Police negotiations. I continue to respond to calls, attend meetings, and manage day-to-day operations. It's been a busy week - thank you to all staff for your continued dedication and hard work.

Finance: Met with Department Heads to review phase 1 of the FY27 budget process. Processed Payroll and Payable. Attended the NESGFOA Conference.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: Week of 9/8/2025 - 9/12/2025

This week the Land Use Office received (12) new applications for permits and issued (25) permit applications. In addition, the Code Enforcement Office received (2) citizen complaints and resolved (0) open complaints and conducted (31) Inspections related to building construction and complaint investigations.

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The buildings and grounds crew attended the Primex training. Returned the generator at States Landing. Light repaired as well as the toilet seat and door hinge for the Public Safety Building. The Historical Society building was attended to. Weed control at the library, the bike path was blown off as well as the pickleball court. Beaches were raked and cleaned. Weekly building checks continue as well as trash and recycle pick up. Mowing and trimming throughout town properties and cemeteries continues.

Regeneration service to truck 1, replaced the trans cooler line and block, refilled system and road tested. Car 222 ignition key issue addressed. 15-R-3 turbo checked noise issue in exhaust and engine pressure sensor. Repair orders completed. The Makita generator carbs cleaned. Truck 19 9 inspection.

Highway: The highway crew attended the Primex training. Driveway permits were approved. Shouldering and ditching with GMI paving. Tree trimming. Reclaiming with GMI on Wentworth Acres and Alpine Park Road. Culvert was flushed on Far Echo. Firewood was split for the firewood. Missing road signs replaced: Airport, Stonewall Lane, Jacobs, and Severance Road.
