The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### Administration & Finance

**Weekly Update:** This week includes several important meetings and initiatives. I'll be participating in Police Department negotiations, attending the Selectmen's meeting, and joining the Trustees of the Trust Funds to discuss clarifications on certain funds—I appreciate their invitation. In preparation for my upcoming budget review with all departments, the Finance Director and I are actively reviewing budget figures. The Capital Improvements Planning Committee (CIPC) continues its work on Thursday, following a productive walkthrough at the DPW facility this past Saturday. Daily operations remain steady across departments, and I appreciate the continued dedication and hard work from everyone during this busy season.

**Finance:** I attended the CIPC meeting where the SAU presented along with the Recreation Department. Payroll and A/P were completed and work continued on the budget.

### Code, Compliance & Health Office: Week of 9/29/2025 - 10/3/2025

This week the Land Use Office received (22) new applications for permits and issued (20) permit applications. In addition, the Code Enforcement Office received (0) citizen complaints and resolved (0) open complaints and conducted (34) Inspections related to building construction and complaint investigations.

**CLOSURE:** The Town Clerk's office will be closed on **Thursday, October 30<sup>th</sup>** for a statewide Clerk training event. Please plan accordingly.

**DMV FEE INCREASES:** Due to a recent law change, a number of motor vehicle-related fees will be increasing as of **January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026**. For those with a January, February, or March registration renewal date who choose to renew their vehicles early (**processed** in 2025), the new fee structure will **not** yet apply. Registrations due in January can be processed as early as October 1<sup>st</sup>. Registrations due in February can be processed as early as November 1<sup>st</sup>. Registrations due in March can be processed as early as December 1<sup>st</sup>.

**ABSENTEE BALLOTS:** [Request forms are now available](#) for the March 10<sup>th</sup>, 2026 Moultonborough Town and School Election. **A recent law change now requires voters to present proof of identity when applying for an absentee ballot.** When requesting an absentee ballot, voters will now be required to do one of the following:

1. Include a photocopy of their photo identification – as defined in [RSA 659:13, II\(a\)](#) – with their absentee ballot application (not sent separately) via mail, email, or fax; **OR**
2. Personally present their qualifying photo identification to the Town Clerk's office when applying in person; **OR**
3. Have their signature notarized in the space provided on the new absentee ballot request form, then submit the application in person or via mail/email/fax. For voters who opt for their signature to be notarized, most banks and public libraries should have at least one notary among their staff. Most libraries will also offer photocopying services if you don't have access to a printer and scanner at home.

Absentee ballots are not yet available but will become available as we get closer to the March 2026 election. The Town Clerk's office will mail absentee ballots when they become available to voters who have valid absentee ballot request forms on file.



### Department of Public Works

**Facilities/Grounds:** The facilities and grounds crew raked beaches, mowed the soccer and baseball fields, along with painting the field lines. Pickleball court was cleared. Door locks at the Public Safety Building repaired. The bike path was cleaned. Fall cleanup at cemeteries.

**Fleet:** Truck 10 fuel injector assessed and taken to Maine for fuel work. 15-R-2 transmission repairs. Truck 20 control handle with pin. Car 181 tire repair and change coolant res. The shop was cleaned and organized. Truck 24 repaired.

**Highway:** The highway crew marked areas for ditching town wide. Ditched Red Hill Road. Millings were added to the overflow road at the Transfer Station. Tree cutting at Middle Neck Cemetery. Assisted GMI with paving. Trucks washed and detailed.

**Transfer Station:** This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 1 container of single stream recycling = 10 tons, 9 containers of construction and demolition = 45 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. 1 pallet of rechargeable batteries weighing 1280 pounds was shipped to be recycled, one 20-yard container of mixed electronics was shipped to be recycled,

and the compost pile was turned. Vehicle counts: Monday 501, Tuesday 526, Friday 488, Saturday 377, Sunday 319 total vehicles served 2211 = 62 vehicles per hour.

#### **Inspections:**

- LP Above Ground Tanks & Piping: 2 inspections conducted.

#### **Operations:**

9/29 A water supply drill was conducted with tankers and engines from Center Harbor, Meredith, Holderness, Sandwich, Tamworth, Tuftonboro joining Moultonborough to transport water from Highway Garage Road 1.2 miles to a fire pond on Moultonboro Neck Road. The goal was to sustain an uninterrupted flow of 500-gallons per minute. The exercise was able to maintain a flow of 750-800 gallons per minute, with periods of 1,000 gallons per minute. Using the “Rural Hitch” technique, which allows for multiple trucks to dump water simultaneously, 50,000 gallons of water was transported during the drill.

- 10/1 The fire chief participated in the technical review of a subdivision proposed for Ferry Road that was conducted by the Land Use Department.
- 10/4 Deputy Houghton with the Forestry truck provided EMS & fire protection services during the Car Show held at Castle in the Clouds.

#### **Burning Permits:**

No fire permits are being issued due to the statewide prohibition on open burning.

#### **Fire Danger:**

Due to the continued lack of widespread rainfall and drought, the Moultonborough area and the Lakes Region of New Hampshire are experiencing increasingly dry conditions that can lead to the easy ignition and rapid spread of fire. As a result, the New Hampshire Forest Rangers have declared Fire Danger levels from HIGH to VERY HIGH for most of the state. Residents and visitors are urged to report any fires to 9-1-1.

#### **Fireworks:**

Due to the high fire danger levels, the use and display of fireworks is discouraged. People displaying fireworks are liable for property damages occurring from fireworks and may face fines up to \$2,000.

#### **Statewide Rules:**

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 21 years old to purchase, possess, or use fireworks.
- Where You Can Use Them: Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with the landowner's written permission or presence. Town beaches, parks, and boat launches are off-limits.
- Types Allowed: Legal fireworks include items like fountains, roman candles, sparklers, ground spinners, and reloadable mortars. High-powered explosives like M-80s, cherry bombs, and large aerial shells are illegal and prohibited.
- Retail Sales: Fireworks must be purchased from licensed New Hampshire retailers. Bringing fireworks in from out of state is prohibited.

#### **Town Restrictions:**

Town Ordinance limits the use of "consumer fireworks" to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.

#### **Liability:**

People displaying can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property. In other words, you can be sued for using fireworks and sparks, embers and debris falling onto property that is not yours. With Very High Fire Danger conditions, use of fireworks is not recommended.

Emergencies can strike without warning—and when they do, having accurate, timely information is critical. That is why the Town of Moultonborough offers a reliable emergency alert system that keeps you connected when it matters most.

This system delivers real-time notifications straight to your phone, email, pager, or even via voice call in urgent situations. Whether it is a shelter-in-place order, evacuation notice, boil water advisory, or significant traffic disruption, you will receive the updates you need to make informed decisions and protect your loved ones.

As more households move away from traditional landlines, it is more important than ever to register your current contact information. Signing up is easy, free, and ensures you will not miss critical alerts—emergency or otherwise.

In addition to urgent situations, the system may also provide non-emergency alerts about significant police or fire activity, or other events that could impact your daily life. Routine information will not be sent—only messages that truly matter.
