The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Update: This week was focused on budget sessions with department managers, keeping daily operations on track, and preparing for next week's selectmen's meeting and joint budget work session with the Board of Selectmen and the Advisory Budget Committee. I also met with representatives from the New Hampshire Municipal Association (NHMA), the New Hampshire Municipal Bond Bank (NHMBB), and Gilford's Town Administrator, Scott Dunn, which proved to be both informative and extremely helpful. The team also recognized the retirement of Denny Emerton, honoring his 22 years of service to the town with sincere appreciation. Now, it's back to budgets!

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: This past week the facilities and grounds crew repaired the trusses to the sand buildings. Grounds maintenance at the Highway Garage, Function Hall, States Landing and the park. A leaking valve was replaced at the Public Safety Building. A service call for the generator at the Academy was addressed. Cremation burial at the Holland Hill Cemetery. Weekly building checks continue. Trash and recycling picked up and disposed of at the Transfer Station. Mowing and trimming throughout town cemeteries and buildings along with leaf cleanup. Scrap wire and batteries were brought to New Hampton. The eye wash valve replaced at the Public Safety Building.

Fleet: The mechanics put a transmission into 15-R-2. Brakes adjusted on truck 10. Truck 11 bed pins lubed. A trip to Viking-Cives to go over the truck build on the new 24. Parts picked up at Freightliner of Maine. 15-E-4 brake checks. 15-R-2 safety inspection. A road call for truck 6 brake problem.

Operations: 10/11 Functioning under the Department's automatic aid policy, Moultonborough, Stewart's Ambulance, Center Harbor, Sandwich, and Tuftonboro were dispatched for a two vehicle, motor vehicle accident with confirmed entrapment on Route 171 near Severance Road. Ambulances from Stewart's, Tuftonboro, and Action Ambulance transported patients to Huggins Hospital. Old Mountain Road was closed briefly while one patient was extricated. This incident occurred during Sandwich Fair weekend, and the Fire Department greatly appreciates the response from our mutual aid partners during this time.

Burning Permits: No fire permits are being issued due to the statewide prohibition on open burning.

Fire Danger: Despite recent rainfall, the continued lack of widespread rainfall and drought, the Moultonborough area and the Lakes Region of New Hampshire are experiencing increasingly dry conditions that can lead to the easy ignition and rapid spread of fire. As a result, the New Hampshire Forest Rangers have declared Fire Danger levels from HIGH to VERY HIGH for most of the state. Residents and visitors are urged to report any fires to 9-1-1.

Fireworks: Due to the high fire danger levels, the use and display of fireworks is discouraged. People displaying fireworks are liable for property damages occurring from fireworks and may face fines up to \$2,000.

Statewide Rules:

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 21 years old to purchase, possess, or use fireworks.
- Where You Can Use Them: Fireworks may only be used on private property that you own, or with the landowner's written permission or presence. Town beaches, parks, and boat launches are off-limits.
- Types Allowed: Legal fireworks include items like fountains, roman candles, sparklers, ground spinners, and reloadable mortars. High-powered explosives like M-80s, cherry bombs, and large aerial shells are illegal and prohibited.
- Retail Sales: Fireworks must be purchased from licensed New Hampshire retailers. Bringing fireworks in from out of state is prohibited.

Town Restrictions: Town Ordinance limits the use of "consumer fireworks" to the hours between 12 noon and 10:00 pm. Exceptions are two holidays, as recognized by the Town: (1) the 4th of July: limit use to 12 noon to 12 midnight; (2) New Year, limit use to 12 noon and up to 15 minutes past midnight of the holiday.

Liability: People displaying can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property. In other words, you can be sued for using fireworks and sparks, embers and debris falling onto property that is not yours. With Very High Fire Danger conditions, use of fireworks is not recommended.

The Town of Moultonborough Alerts! Emergencies can strike without warning—and when they do, having accurate, timely information is critical. That is why the Town of Moultonborough offers a reliable emergency alert system that keeps you connected when it matters most.

This system delivers real-time notifications straight to your phone, email, pager, or even via voice call in urgent situations. Whether it is a shelter-in-place order, evacuation notice, boil water advisory, or significant traffic disruption, you will receive the updates you need to make informed decisions and protect your loved ones.

As more households move away from traditional landlines, it is more important than ever to register your current contact information. Signing up is easy, free, and ensures you will not miss critical alerts—emergency or otherwise.

In addition to urgent situations, the system may also provide non-emergency alerts about significant police or fire activity, or other events that could impact your daily life. Routine information will not be sent—only messages that truly matter.
