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The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### **Administration & Finance**

**Weekly Update:** It's been a busy and productive week, marked by active participation in several key meetings: the Selectmen's meeting on Tuesday night, the CIPC meeting on Wednesday night, and the ABC meeting on Thursday night. On Thursday morning, the Finance Director and I met with the Superintendent and Business Administrator of SAU 45 at the school to discuss financial processes and other meaningful topics, all in an effort to collaborate effectively for the benefit of our residents. Daily operations and internal personnel matters have continued alongside preparations for the start of a new month, and the calendar is moving quickly. As we approach the Veterans Day observance, please note the upcoming closure of Town Hall and the Transfer Station on Tuesday, November 11, 2025. **Finance:** Worked on budget, payroll, payables and setting tax rate.

### **Department of Public Works**

**Facilities/Grounds:** The facilities crew worked at States Landing digging trench for power, back filling the trench and grading. The block wall was constructed, and loam and other materials were added. The Public Safety alert on the dispatch panel was repaired.

**Fleet:** The mechanics repaired Truck 6 brakes. Tools picked up and put away in the garage. Inventory was taken of the Police Department tires. Road call for Eq 40 and truck 7. The Mohawk lifts were installed. Sanders were installed into Trucks 1 and 11. Truck 6 sander chain was repaired.

**Highway:** The highway staff screened dirt for grading roads. Trees were marked for cutting. Sanders were maintained for winter. Evans road was watered and rolled. Ledge pack was added to Kent Road. Brush at the Transfer Station was chipped. Composting at the Transfer Station was completed. Wood chips were loaded into the chip trailer. Bodge Hill was graded. The shop kitchen and back room were cleaned.

**Transfer Station:** This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycling = 10 tons, 8 containers of construction and demolition = 40 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The Highway Department screened the compost pile and is ready for the residents to pick up. The Highway Department is in the process of chipping all the brush in the deposit area. After the brush has been chipped and the brush deposit area is empty the Transfer Station will be accepting brush. Vehicle counts: Monday 427, Tuesday 430, Friday 398, Saturday 426, Sunday 279 total vehicles served 1960=55 per hour.

**Burning Permits:**

Fire permits are now being issued. The statewide prohibition on open burning has been lifted by the Governor and Council on October 29<sup>th</sup>.

Rainfall over the past couple of weeks has helped reduce the fire danger. Weather forecasts looking ahead have more precipitation providing relief to the high fire danger conditions.
