The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Weekly Update: I prepared for the December 16, 2025, Selectmen's meeting this week, including responding to questions from the Advisory Budget Committee. Please note that all Town Offices and the Transfer Station will be closed on Christmas Day, December 25. The Town Clerk, Tax Collector, Recreation and Transfer Station will also be closed on Friday, December 26. In addition, all Town Offices will be closed on New Year's Day, January 1, 2026. As we conclude the year, I want to acknowledge the productive collaboration among the Board of Selectmen, Department Managers, Boards, Committees, and staff. It has been a privilege to work with such a dedicated team over the past five months. I extend my best wishes to all residents for a safe and enjoyable holiday season.

Finance: Processed payroll and payables. Worked on cost items for DPW CBA.

Code, Compliance & Health Office: Week of 12/8/2025 - 12/12/2025

Department of Public Works

Facilities/Grounds: The facilities and grounds crew treated and plowed all town buildings. The ice rink was cleared of snow and flooded. Met with electricians at the Town hall for the hot water heater. Aqua-therms at States Landing were put on. Mouse traps were set at the library. Christmas lights were put up at the Function Hall and Public Safety Building. Walkways were shoveled and treated after the snow events. The Zamboni was used on the ice rink. Lights for the recreation department were put up.

Fleet: The mechanics diagnosed truck 4 plow issue, joy sticks changed out. Equipment 14 lost hydraulics, no pump pressure. CAT was called to repair the unit. Truck 9 front wing cable repaired. Truck 3 battery replacement. Truck 6 wing issue on Lakeshore Road. 15-t-1 ECM issue was addressed at the Public Safety Building. Rear sprocket on truck 7 and sander hydraulic issue on truck 10.

Highway: The highway crew plowed and treated roads throughout town after the winter weather. Salt was delivered and pushed up into the salt shed. Sander was removed from truck 24 and the other truck bodies were picked up. The tires on truck 7 were changed. Trucks were washed after the storm. Sanders and chains were greased. Roads were scraped and treated after the storm events.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 3 containers of construction and demolition = 20 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, compost pile turned, electronics container exchanged, Freon containing devices were recycled, propane tanks were picked up to be recycled. Vehicle counts: Monday 349, Tuesday 346, Friday 373, Saturday 364, Sunday 97 total vehicles served 1529.

- LP Above Ground Tanks & Piping: 5 inspections conducted

Operations:

- 12/11 Firefighter Manville oversaw and coordinated the annual flow testing of self-contained breathing apparatus working with Fire Tech & Safety to inspect and test 25 SCBA unit. Annual testing ensures that our SCBA are functioning properly to provide breathing air when fighting fires.
- 12/12 The fire department participated in the Recreation Department's Dinner, Delights and Holiday Lights at the Function Hall. Providing Caroling Karaoke and Holiday tree ornament claw grab for a prize, a good time was had by all.

Burning Permits:

Per Administrative Rule Res 5601.02, A fire permit shall be required for all open burning when the ground is not covered by snow. "*Ground covered with snow*" means the area within a 100-foot radius from the fire edge is covered with snow or other frozen precipitation sufficient to prevent the combustion of woodland fuels until the fire is completely extinguished. As there is now snow cover in place, no fire permit is required for permissible open burning.
