The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Town Administrator: An appropriation defined under RSA 32: 3, II “means an amount of money appropriated for a specified purpose by the legislative body.” At their recent Board of Selectmen meeting the Selectmen signed New Hampshire Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) MS-232 form, which reports to DRA the total appropriations approved at Town Meeting. Essentially the form is the towns operating and capital budgets for the calendar year, however, DRA also uses the form to set the towns property tax rate. To calculate the towns rate, DRA subtracts the appropriations (MS-232) from the towns estimated revenues (MS-434), divides the sum into the towns total assessed property value (MS-1) and then multiplies the amount by \$1,000 to equal the towns property tax rate for the calendar year. DRA generally sets property tax rates in the fall.

Assessor: The first half tax warrant has been printed and signed by the Board of Selectmen. New property record cards have been uploaded to the online GIS system, so that they match the updated assessed values. The GIS maps will be updated soon, to reflect, new subdivisions, boundary line adjustments, lot mergers, site plans, etc. and will also be in sync with the 2021, 1st half tax bill. The NH Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) will soon begin monitoring a sample of the properties that Whitney Consulting Group inspected, in 2020, as part of the cyclical inspection process. They will send notification to taxpayers whose properties were randomly chosen as part of their monitoring sample. The Assessing department is seeking applicants for an open Assessing Technician position. The job description and requirements can be found on the Town website. Department of Public Works

Highway: The highway team worked on multiple projects during the week that included blowing roadside ditches, addressing a few culvert, drainage, and roadside tree issues, removed a large rock

out of Blake Rd in preparation for the upcoming paving work, began grading of gravel roads, and assisted the facilities team with hanging of the village banners and flags. Public Works is also working with the elementary school for their vegetable garden project by delivering compost from the transfer station as well as some boulders.

Facilities & Grounds: The past week the F&G crew installed the new banners in the village with the help of the Highway crew and the Police Dept. The crew has been mowing and trimming town facilities as well spring maintenance in the cemeteries. We have been setting new flags and veteran markers in the cemeteries. We are planning for our crew to finish beach cleanups on Wednesday. The soccer field has been stripped, the nets have been installed, and it is ready to be used.

CAR161 2016 Ford Police Interceptor replaced tire valve stem left rear tire. 15-E-4 2001 H.M.E. pumper repaired tailpipe assembly. Parts run to Nortrax to get correct tie rod end.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste, 2 containers of single stream recycle and 7 containers of construction and demolition. Car counts for this week are Monday 366, Tuesday 262, Friday 412, Saturday 352 Sunday 300 total of 1692 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 269 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 9 Assist Citizens, 19 Motor Vehicle Stops, 19 Assists to Fire/EMS, 1 Directed Patrols, 1 Arrests, 2 complaints, 4 MV Accidents, 3 MV Complaints, 2 Residential Alarms, No Commercial Alarms and 1 K-9 complaints. Officer Jaclyn Cortese attended the Field Training Officer course put on by Granite State Police Career Counseling on 5/17 – 5/19. All officers completed firearms training between the dates of 5/12 & 5/19.

Recreation Department

Summer Camp counselor positions and lifeguard positions are still open. MRD is also seeking to fill our Waterfront Supervisor position. The interview and hiring process is ongoing for summer staff positions.
