The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Assessor: The NH Department of Revenue Administration (DRA) has begun monitoring a sample of the properties that Whitney Consulting Group inspected, in 2020, as part of the cyclical inspection process. Notifications were sent to taxpayers whose properties were randomly chosen as part of their monitoring sample. Department of Public Works

Highway: The Highway team continued working on road maintenance activities including tree trimming, ditching, and culvert cleaning concentrating their efforts in the Lee Rd, Lees Mill Rd, States Landing, and Sheridan Rd areas. Street signs were replaced on several roads, and we supported one cremation burial in Bean Cemetery as well.

Household Hazardous Waste Day: On Wednesday evening, the 2nd HHW day coordination meeting was held with LRPC and surrounding communities. Facilities & Grounds: The past week the F & G crew maintained cemeteries, spread mulch at the historical society, and assisted the Recreation Department in assembling a swim dock as well as putting out the swim lines and the aforementioned dock. Other town properties were maintained as usual (Lion's Club, Lee's Mills, etc.) Specifically, a new hot water tank was installed at the Lion's Club. We continue to look for seasonal help. a/c system and added dye to system to check for leaks. Road call to States Landing to repair door. Road call to Sheridan Rd. Operator reported no charging condition. Checked out system and ordered alternator. EQ12 2009 John Deere backhoe operator reported w.i.f. light on. Drained fuel filter water trap. Reported coolant leak, operator refilled system and tightened clamp. EQ14 2015 Cat 926M loader greased unit. TRK4 2012 F350 mounted summer tires and rims. Replaced D.E.F. fluid pump and reset system. Performed PM-B service and installed b/u alarm. Start replacing decals. Got pull behind street broom up and running to sweep the roads. 15-R-1 2012 H.M.E. rescue unit performed PM-A service and state inspection. Tightened up front spring hanger. Load chip trailers and trucks. Parts runs to H.P. Fairfield's and other vendors in Concord area. Dropped off water sample to D.E.S. labs for Facility Maintenance.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste, 3 containers of single stream recycle, 6 containers of construction and demolition and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. 99 Freon containing devices were evacuated and 106 large 20# propane tanks were recycled. Car counts: Monday 329, Tuesday 356, Friday 558, Saturday 414, Sunday 303 total 1960 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 292 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 16 Assist Citizens, 30 Motor Vehicle Stops, 10 Assists to Fire/EMS, No Directed Patrols, 4 Arrests, 10 complaints, 2 MV Accidents, 6 MV Complaints, 7 Residential Alarms, 1 Commercial Alarms and 3 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire/Rescue Department: For the period of 06/04/2021 to 06/10/2021, there were 16 calls for service: There was: 1 - Outside equipment fire, 6 - EMS incidents, 1 - EMS/Rescue standby, 2 - Power lines downed, 1 - Public service call, 1 - No incident found upon arrival at dispatched location, 1 - Alarm system sounded due to malfunction, 1 - Smoke detector activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 - Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 - Hazardous material release investigation, no hazard found. **2021 Incidents Year to Date: 424. Up 23.25% from 2020.**
Automatic Aid: twice from Center Harbor, once from Sandwich, Tuftonboro. **Mutual Aid:** none.
Overlapping Incidents: 4 Year to Date: 84. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations

The Day Shift continued work on servicing and testing dry hydrants. Work on getting the new utility truck into service is progressing. The radios and most of the emergency lighting have been completed. We are waiting on a few lights and the center console, and the truck should go into service by the end of the week.

The Public Safety Building is open for residents and contractors to obtain fire/burning permits, permits to install, and operate oil fired equipment are being issued through a service window installed in the lobby door. The meeting room and public restrooms remain closed during the pandemic due to sanitizing concerns. Residents and businesses having questions life safe and fire code issues may access fire department services through the lobby or by calling 476-5658 for service.

Burning Permits

Fire permits are required for all types of fires in all areas of Moultonborough. Brush burning is permitted, prior to 5pm, with a valid fire permit when there is sustained rain occurring. Per Res 5601.01 *“Raining” means sustained precipitation that is actively occurring of sufficient intensity and duration so as to prevent fire from spreading in woodland fuels”* 2021 Fire permits are available on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. Fire permits are also available at no charge at the Public Safety Building.

Recreation Department
