The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Assessor: A start-up meeting was held for the 2021 Valuation Update. The virtual meeting was hosted by the DRA and included Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) and the Town Assessor. WCG will begin reviewing qualified sales for the 2021 revaluation, soon. We are currently working on finalizing recommendations to the Board of Selectmen for abatement applications that were received for the 2020 tax year. Department of Public Works

Highway: The Highway team continued working on road maintenance activities including tree trimming, ditching, and culvert cleaning concentrating their efforts in the Lee Rd, Lees Mill Rd, Blake Rd, Red Hill, Lake Shore and Alpine Park Rd areas. Roadway pavement preservation on Blake Rd included a pavement shim and overlay.

Fleet: Car151 2015 Ford interceptor Utility, repaired exhaust system installed decals and swapped plates. Setting up center console for code enforcement. EQ35 Quick Attach skid steer broom road call to Lees Mills rd. to repair control harness to broom. Also pulled hydraulic motor later that day due to an internal fault and ordered a new one. CAR211 2021 Ford Police Utility performed PM-B service, replaced rear tire due to road puncture, and performed a state inspection. 15-R-2 2019 F550 H.M.E. Mini-Evo road call to public safety for a no start. Ran diagnostics and found issue with battery energy module. Replaced defective battery and truck was sent to Irwin Motors under warranty. CAR162 2016 Ford Police Sedan replaced pass. side headlight bulb and

socket. TRK18 2010 Dodge Grand Caravan recharged a/c/ system and added dye to check for leaks. EQ54 tow behind broom cut off old hitch and weld on new pintle eyelet assembly. TRK1 2019 RAM 3500 set up auxiliary fuel tank in bed of the truck. EQ32 2017 Eager Beaver 20-ton trailer replaced trailer power cord and plug assembly, repaired jack handle, replaced trailer air supply lines. Load wood chips. Parts run to Concord for EQ32.

Transfer Station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste, 3 containers of single stream recycle and 5 containers of construction and demolition. The brush pile was burned, compost pile turned, and scrap metal container filled. Car counts: Monday 502, Tuesday 460, Friday 562, Saturday 475, Sunday 291 total of 2290 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 217 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 9 Assist Citizens, 20 Motor Vehicle Stops, 12 Assists to Fire/EMS, 1 Directed Patrols, 1 Arrests, 1 complaint, 3 MV Accidents, 9 MV Complaints, 2 Residential Alarms, 2 Commercial Alarms and 2 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire/Rescue Department: For the period of 06/18/2021 to 06/24/2021, there were 20 calls for service: There was: 15 - EMS incidents, 1 - Motor vehicle accidents with injuries, 1 - Water leak, 2 - Alarm system sounded due to malfunction, 1 - Alarm system activations, no fire, unintentional. **2021 Incidents Year to Date: 464 Up 19.89% from 2020**
Automatic Aid: six times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 4 **Year to Date:** 94. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Burning Permits: 2021 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com.

Fireworks: New Hampshire State Law and Moultonborough Ordinance #22 - What are Permissible Fireworks? Permissible Fireworks are consumer firework devices that have been made legal for sale, possession and use here in New Hampshire, and can be purchased in any of our licensed retail stores statewide.

Requirements: 1) Anyone interested in purchasing, possessing, or using Permissible Fireworks must be at least 21 years of age. 2) Shall only be used on private property which you own, or have written permission from the landowner, or be in the owner's presence. 3) Must follow ALL locally adopted local ordinances. Moultonborough Ordinance #22 limits the use of "consumer fireworks to the hours between **12 noon and 10:00 pm**, except on the 4th of July, which can be used from 12 noon to 12 midnight. 4) You can be held liable in any civil action for damages to another's property.

Recreation Department

Moultonborough Recreation will be closed on Monday July 5 in observance of Independence Day. All programs, including summer camp, pickleball & drop-in programs are canceled for that day.
