The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Assessor: Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) has completed the scheduled informal hearings. Property owners who attended an informal will receive a letter indicating whether a change was made to their property's updated value.

A list of Town-wide preliminary values is posted in the “2021 Valuation Update Information”, section on the Assessor’s page of the Town’s website. Printed lists can be found at the Assessor’s office and at the town library.

The assessing office has received numerous phone calls, from taxpayers, asking for an explanation of “Features” as seen on their “new value” letters.

Features are improvements that are not accounted for in our “new” assessing software’s building calculation. Most often they include improvements that are external to the main dwelling such as a dock, pool, paving or a shed. However, they can also be improvements that are integrated into the house, such as a fireplace, hearth, or whirlpool/jet tub. **Please Note:** Features is not a new, additional assessment. Our old assessing software included these types of items in the Building Value.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped 2 containers of Municipal Solid Waste = 24 Tons, 3 containers of Single Stream Recycling = 15 Tons, and 6 containers of Construction and Demolition = 30 Tons. Scrap Metal was not pick. Car counts were as follows: Tuesday 692, Friday 558, Saturday 315, Sunday 256. Total 1821.

Fleet: TRK6 2019 Western Star 4700SF replaced rear brakes and drums. Adjust as required. Install dust shields. Replaced pintle hook receiver assembly. Repaired left rear parking lights. Performed state inspection. TRK9 2014 Kenworth 470 performed state inspection. Adjusted rear brakes and repaired lights. Performed monthly facility audit. Cleaned up shop. Repaired tire machine.

Facilities and Grounds: The past week the F & G crew continued summer maintenance at various cemeteries and town properties. We raked the beaches and mowed and trimmed lees mills for the steamboat rally. We replaced the domestic hot water circulator at the Public Safety Building. I met with a couple of paint contractors at the recreation building for some exterior painting.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 256 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 11 Assist Citizens, 26 Motor Vehicle Stops, 12 Assists to Fire/EMS, 2 Directed Patrols, 2 Arrests, 5 complaints, 3 MV Accidents, 5 MV Complaints, 1 Residential Alarm, No Commercial Alarms and 2 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire/Rescue Department: For the period of 09/03/2021 to 09/09/2021, there were 21 calls for service: There was: 1 Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 12 EMS incidents, 1 Motor vehicle accident with injuries, 1 Assist the Police, 1 Assist the physically disabled, 1 Dispatched & cancelled en-route, 1 Hazardous material release investigation, with no Haz-Mat found, 1 Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 1 Smoke detector activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 Alarm system activation due to malfunction. **2021 Incidents Year to Date:** 772 Up 17% from 2020 Automatic Aid: Once from Center Harbor and twice from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 4 Year to Date: 166 Percentage of Call Volume: 21.5%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: Supra Key install new key, lock rekeyed. Inspection of Oil burning Equipment, new furnace installation at Rec. Dept. Labor Day, Day shift station staffed by Call personnel from 8am to 4pm. New E-9-1-1 address issued for Tax Map 144, Lot 17 to be 19 High Meadow Road. Chief Bengtson and FF. Brown met with the Director of Castle in the Clouds to discuss access to the dry hydrant at the fishpond. Recent landscaping improvement have impeded access to the dry hydrant for fire apparatus. Castle in the Clouds will address this issue.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.nh.gov/covid19> indicate that as of 09/13/2021, Moultonborough currently is shown as having 18 new cases in the last 14-days, 14 active cases, and has had a cumulative total of 287 cases. 64.8% (2,683) of the Town's 4,140 population has been fully vaccinated.

Burning Permits: 2021 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is allowed to kindle the fire.

Moultonborough Recreation Department
