The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration & Finance

Assessor: Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues to work on completing the 2021 phase of the cyclical inspections. Their field staff will be working throughout town through the end of the year. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor.

A complete breakdown of the 2021 tax rate, including year to year comparisons, a history of the tax rate and equalization ratio can be found on the Assessor webpage, using the “Tax Rate History” link.

The property record cards (PRC's) with the newly established 2021 assessed values, are now posted on the town's On-line GIS website. To view a property record card, go to the Town's homepage and select “Tax & GIS Maps,” from the left-hand column. We are updating the welcome message on Tax & GIS webpage along with working on instructions to assist in the use of the GIS system,

The Department of Revenue Administration has approved WCG's 2020 Valuation Update Mass Appraisal Report. A copy of the report is available, for review, in the Assessor's office.

Town Clerk: The Town Clerks office has been seeing a higher than usual rate of returned mail. When mail is returned to us, we make every effort to contact the individual and, in most cases, the intended recipient confirms that the address we mailed it to is correct. pertain to motor vehicle titles which are issued by the NH Title Bureau. Titles applied for at NH Town/City Clerks offices are currently taking up to 12 weeks to be issued.

DID YOU KNOW? When you renew your boat registration through the state, the town does not collect any of that revenue. Paying for your boat at the town level does cost \$5 more than the state price, but it allows our municipality to collect those \$5 plus an additional portion of your regular registration amount. This keeps more of your money at the local level and benefits our beautiful town! Boat renewals for the 2022 season can be processed any time now.

Department of Public Works

Highway: Last week the Highway Team did some tree work on Winaukee and Bartlett Landing, Kona Farm Rd, and Red Hill, plowed/treated the roads with the storm events as well as performed maintenance on the truck/equipment fleet.

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream = 10 tons, 3 containers of construction and demolition = 15 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Brush pile was burned, and compost pile was turned.

Readjusted on-spots. 15-F-2A 1985 Chevy K3500 replaced starter and alternator and rewire plugs. Replaced battery as well due to an electrical issue.

Facilities & Grounds: The past week the facilities and ground crew plowed and treated town facilities, schools, and roads. We assisted the alarm company with the installation of new cameras at the transfer station.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 188 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 4 Assist Citizens, 16 Motor Vehicle Stops, 11 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 1 Arrest, 4 complaints, 3 MV Accidents, 2 MV Complaints, 7 Residential Alarms, 5 Commercial Alarms, 1 theft and 3 K-9 complaints.

Training: Chief Stillman, Sergeant Beede, Sergeant Baker and Officer Cortese Taser Transition Training, 12/13/2021.

Moultonborough Fire/Rescue Department: For the period of 12/10/2021 to 12/16/2021, there were 13 calls for service: There was: 9 EMS incidents, 1 Rescue/EMS Stand-by, 2 Lockout, residential, 1 Alarm system activation, unintentional, no fire. **2021 Incidents Year to Date: 1024 Up 14.7% from 2020.** The Fire Department has surpassed the 1,000-incident mark, making 2021 our busiest year on record. **Automatic Aid:** Once from Center Harbor and once from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** None. **Overlapping Incidents:** None. **Year to Date:** 208. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 20.7%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Burning Permits Burning permits are not required when there is sufficient snow cover on the ground to prevent the spread of fire to the woodlands. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is allowed to kindle the fire.
