The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Assessing: Our office continues to assist property owners with questions and concerns related to their 2021 assessed values, as reflected on their December tax bills. We are also continuing our work on integrating and reviewing our new and existing data in the Avitar assessing database.

Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues to work on completing the 2021 phase of the cyclical inspections. Their field staff will be working throughout town through the end of the year. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 4 containers of municipal solid waste = 48 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons, 3 containers of construction and demolition = 15 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Brush pile was burned.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 220 log entries, which included the following calls for service: 3 Assist Citizens, 45 Motor Vehicle Stops, 11 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 1 complaint, 3 MV Accidents, 1 MV Complaints, 6 Residential Alarms, 1 Commercial Alarms, and 1 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Department: For the period of 12/17/2021 to 12/31/2021, there were forty-three calls for service: There was: 1 Building fire (Tuftonboro), 15 EMS incidents, 1 Motor vehicle accident with injuries, 1 Motor vehicle accident without injuries, 1 Power line down, 1 Arcing, shorted electrical equipment, 1 Water leak, residential, 1 Public service, 1 Cover assignment, 8 Dispatched & cancelled en route, 2 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched location, 2 Authorized controlled burning, 1 Alarm system sounded due to malfunction, 1 Carbon monoxide detector sounded due to malfunction, 5 Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 Carbon monoxide detector activation, no CO found. **Total 2021 Incidents: 1069 Up 13.9% from 2020.** The Fire Department has surpassed the 1,000-incident mark, making 2021 our busiest year on record. **Automatic Aid:** received three times from Center Harbor, once from Tuftonboro and once from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** once to Center Harbor and twice to Tuftonboro **Overlapping Incidents: 7 Year to Date: 215 Percentage of Call Volume: 20.1%.** Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Burning Permits: Burning permits are not required when there is sufficient snow cover on the ground to prevent the spread of fire to the woodlands. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is allowed to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
