The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Assessing: Our office continues to assist property owners with questions and concerns related to their 2021 assessed values, as reflected on their December tax bills. We are also continuing our work on reviewing all new construction and building permits, in preparation for the 2022 tax year.

Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues to work on completing cyclical inspections. Their field staff will be working throughout town. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor.

Town Clerk: In the month of December 2021, the Town Clerk's office processed 874 motor vehicle registrations, 149 aquatherm permits, 61 boat registrations, 7 dog licenses, 110 motor vehicle titles, and 21 vital records (birth/death/marriage certificates and/or divorce decrees). We also processed wetlands applications, received, and managed absentee ballot requests, and performed various other services.

DID YOU KNOW? You might be able to write off the Municipal Fees (considered a personal property tax) you pay on your motor vehicle registrations at tax time. Save your renewal letter or bring your registrations to your tax professional to inquire. Town and state fees are printed separately on the right side of your registrations so you can easily distinguish which is tax deductible and which is not.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons and 2 containers of construction and demolition = 10 tons.

Car counts Monday 273, Tuesday 182, Friday 372, Saturday 281, Sunday 250 total of 1358 residents served.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 242 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 7 Assist Citizens, 19 Motor Vehicle Stops, 8 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 2 complaints, 2 MV Accidents, 2 MV Complaints, 7 Residential Alarms, 1 Commercial Alarms, and 0 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 12/31/2021 to 01/06/2022, there were twenty-seven calls for service: There was: 1 Chimney fire, 1 Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 12 EMS incidents, 2 Carbon monoxide incidents, 1 Water leak, 1 Public service, 3 Dispatched & cancelled en route, 1 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched location, 1 Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 3 Alarm system sounded due to malfunction, 1 Carbon monoxide detector activation due to malfunction. **Total Incidents year to date: 27 Up 22.7% from 2021** **Automatic Aid:** received twice from Tuftonboro and three times from Stewart's Ambulance. Given once to Center Harbor and once to Sandwich **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 4. **Year to Date:** 4. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 14.8%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: Chief Bengtson participated in online meeting of the Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid Executive Committee. Chief Bengtson and Lt. Frangelli met with the Town Administrator to review and discuss the proposed FY 2022-2023 Fire Department budget. Chief Bengtson performed a Place of Assembly inspection for a Whittier Highway restaurant. Firefighter Houghton and Chief Bengtson met with Joe Cartier, the Emergency Services Reporting Coordinator from the NH Dept. of Safety, Division of Fire Standards and Training & EMS to get the Department set up for NHESR. NHESR is part of the Respond NH Emergency Services User Portal which will allow fire department to report their fire and EMS incidents to the State Fire Marshal's office and the Bureau of EMS. It will also allow for personnel to register for Fire Academy classes, view their training transcripts and renew their EMS licenses.

Burning Permits: Burning permits are not required when there is sufficient snow cover on the ground to prevent the spread of fire to the woodlands.

2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is allowed to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
