The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Assessing: Our office is in the process of updating our exemption and credit qualification verification letters, which will be sent out to recipients in the coming weeks. We also continue to work on reviewing all new construction and building permits, in preparation for the 2022 tax year permit inspections.

Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues to work on completing cyclical inspections. Their field staff will be working throughout town. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor.

Department of Public Works

Highway: The Highway Team continues to monitor the roads in concert with the weekly weather events treating roads throughout town as well as performing routine winter maintenance on the fleet and plow equipment.

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 1 container of single stream recycle = 5 tons and 2 containers of construction and demolition = 10 tons.

Car counts: Monday 247, Tuesday 220, Friday 459, Saturday 72, Sunday 129 total of 1127 residents served.

Facilities and Grounds: The past week Facilities & Grounds crew continues with the winter maintenance of snow removal and treating of the roads, sidewalks, and parking lots. The crew has been maintaining the rink and monitoring the aquatherms at Lee's mills docks.

EQ14 2015 CAT 926M replaced windshield washer pumps. Replaced strobe light brackets. Cleaned parts room. Load trucks. Replaced plow swing hose on fisher plow.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 241 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 8 Assist Citizens, 26 Motor Vehicle Stops, 8 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 1 Arrest, 4 complaints, 3 MV Accidents, 3 MV Complaints, 6 Residential Alarms, 2 Commercial Alarms, and 2 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 01/21/2022 to 01/27/2022, there were sixteen calls for service: There was: 1 Building fire, 1 Chimney fire, 8 EMS incidents, 1 Overheated motor, 1 Water leak, 1 Public service, 1 Dispatched & cancelled en route, 2 Authorized controlled burning. **Total 2022 Incidents: 60. Up 15.3% from 2021. Automatic Aid:** received Center Harbor twice. **Mutual Aid:** Center Harbor and Sandwich for building fire **Overlapping Incidents:** none. **Year to Date: 6. Percentage of Call Volume: 10%.** Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 1/21 Moultonborough firefighters responded to a building fire at 26 Birch Lane. The fire was upgraded to a first alarm, bringing mutual aid companies to the scene. Engine 1 arrived on scene and found a small fire in the garage, which was quickly extinguished. Mutual aid was cancelled except for Center Harbor and Sandwich companies. Firefighter Gatherum was the first on scene and removed the occupants from the building and provided a good size up of the fire before the first engine arrived. There were no injuries and the home sustained minor damage and remains occupiable.

1/22 Firefighters Bryant, Gatherum and Gravelle participated in an ice rescue training session in Gilford with the hovercraft.

1/25 Rescue 2 was taken to Irwin Ford in Laconia at the direction of the Town Mechanic for an oil leak that is covered under warranty. The vehicle was assessed and found to be covered under the warranty. Parts are currently out of stock for the repair, upon obtaining the parts, Irwin's will schedule the repair. The vehicle will be out of service for one week at that time. The vehicle remains in service at this time.

Burning Permits: There is now sufficient snow cover on the ground to permit burning without a fire permit. Permits are not required when there is sufficient snow cover on the ground to prevent the spread of fire to the woodlands.

2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com.

The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is allowed to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
