The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Assessing: Exemption and credit qualification verification letters, were sent out, to recipients, last week. The purpose of these letters is to ensure that the recipients qualifications status has not changed, and our records are accurate and in compliance with State laws and rules. We are now in the process of reviewing the responses to these letters, as they are returned. We also continue to work on reviewing all new construction and building permits, in preparation for the 2022 tax year permit inspections.

Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues to work on completing cyclical inspections. Their field staff will be working throughout town. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor.

Town Clerk: Dog licenses are due April 30th of every year. Renewals can be processed as early as January so if you happen to be in our office renewing your vehicle, registering to vote, or obtaining a certified copy of your birth certificate, why not license your dog at the same time?

For new dogs and dogs who have recently received a rabies vaccination, we will need a copy of your up-to-date rabies certificate. Veterinarians do send us monthly batches of rabies certificates so we may already have yours on file, but sometimes you're in here before we've received it so it's always safest to bring your copy along. If you forget to bring it, our wonderful local vets can often email us a copy of the rabies certificate right when you're at our counter.

Dogs that are not licensed on time may be issued a Civil Forfeiture fine of \$25 on top of the regular license fee (listed below). There is also a \$1 per month per dog late fee added beginning in June. Dog licenses can be renewed online, through the mail, through the drop box to the left of Town

Hall's front door, and in person for the following amounts: \$7.50 for a spayed/neutered dog, \$10 for an unaltered dog, \$3 for the first dog owned by a resident 65 years or older. Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 5 containers of construction and demolition = 25 tons. Bulk shingle load was picked up and the brush pile was burned.

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 255 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 7 Assist Citizens, 30 Motor Vehicle Stops, 6 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 6 complaints, 2 MV Accidents, 5 MV Complaints, 1 Residential Alarms, 0 Commercial Alarms, and 1 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 02/04/2022 to 02/10/2022, there were ten calls for service: There was: 1 Vehicle fire (Town owned), 4 EMS incidents, 1 Motor vehicle accident with injuries, 1 Carbon monoxide incident, 1 LP gas leak, 1 No incident found upon arrival at dispatched address, 1 Hazardous materials release investigation with no hazardous materials found. **Total 2022 Incidents: 82. Down 19.5% from 2021 Automatic Aid:** None. **Mutual Aid:** None. **Overlapping Incidents:** Two. **Year to Date:** 8. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 10%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 2/7 - Chief Bengtson conducted the monthly Officer's meeting within Call Officers. 2/10 - The Day Crew and the fire chief performed a Place of Assembly inspection at a Whittier Highway restaurant.

Burning Permits: There is now sufficient snow cover on the ground to permit burning without a fire permit. Permits are not required when there is sufficient snow cover on the ground to prevent the spread of fire to the woodlands.

2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
