The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 4 containers of construction and demolition = 20 tons. Brush pile burned; compost pile turned. Car counts, Monday 193, Tuesday 241, Friday 301, Saturday 325, Sunday 289 total 1349 residents served.

Fleet: 15-U-1 2021 F350 performed state inspection. EQ47 Bobcat sweeper repaired broom drive chain sprocket and shaft and adjust unit. TRK9 2014 Kenworth 470 performed an A-PM. Replaced front and rear N.O.X. sensors and reset system. Road tested unit. CAR211 2021 Ford Police Interceptor Utility performed a PM-B service. TRK3 2018 RAM 3500 replaced b/u alarm repaired wiring to trailer plug. Checked out directional light issue. TRK4 2012 F350 checked out c.ac. system. Blew out radiator core and reset. replaced water in fuel sensor pigtail and sealed up wiring. Replaced driver door bumper stop rod assembly. EQ14 2015 CAT 926M loader replaced step assembly and cover. EQ25 2006 CASE 60XT skid steer replaced fuel sender, replaced seeping hydraulic line to boom. Checked out battery and replaced unit. Cleaned connections. TRK19 2019 RAM 1500 replaced pass. side rear strobe light assembly. EQ54 tow behind broom replaced tires and service for the season. Serviced POGO trench packer for the season. EQ50 p.t.o. wood splitter fabricate stands for unit.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 193 log entries, which included the following calls for service: 6 Assist Citizens, 17 Motor Vehicle Stops, 6 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 4 complaints, 1 MV Accidents, 1 MV Complaints, 6 Residential Alarms, 0 Commercial Alarms, and 1 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 03/25/2022 to 03/31/2022, there were twelve calls for service. There was: 1 - Excessive heat, overheat scorch burns with no ignition, 6 - EMS call, 1 - Public service, 2 - No incident found on arrival at dispatch address, 1 - Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 1 - Smoke detector activation (no fire), unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 188 Automatic. Aid:** received three times from Center Harbor. **Mutual Aid:** provide mutual aid once to Sandwich. **Overlapping Incidents: 0. Year to Date: 19. Percentage of Call Volume: 12%.** Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 3/29 The Day Shift performed a Place of Assembly inspection for renewal of liquor license for a Governor Wentworth Highway restaurant. No violations were reported. 3/31 Chief Bengtson completed Primex's Collaborative Leadership: Model for Public Safety Chiefs program. The program began in October and has focused on building and maintaining productive relationships between Fire and Police Chief to manage and mitigate common problems.

COVID-19 Status Report: The New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services COVID-19 Dashboards located at <https://www.nh.gov/covid19> indicate that as of 03/31/2022, Moultonborough currently is shown as "Data Suppressed" for new cases in the last 14-days, no active cases, and has had a cumulative total of 663 cases. 16% of the Town's population has contracted COVID-19 virus. 68.5% of the Town's population has been fully vaccinated.

New Hampshire currently has fully vaccinated 61.3 % of the population. 70.7% of NH residents have received the first dose.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are now required for all open burning. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that “written permission” must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
