The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

### **Administration and Finance**

**Town Administrator:** Over the past week I attended a few events that might be of interest to you. In particular, I represented the town last week when the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) recognized local business “Electrical Installations” for being SBA’s 2022 Family-Owned Business of the Year for New Hampshire and New England. At this event I presented the Fritz family, owners of Electrical Installations, with the National Small Business Week 2022 Proclamation that the Board signed at our April 7<sup>th</sup> meeting. Day after this SBA event I had another session in Leadership Lakes Region, focus was “Health Issues Day.” Our group had presentations about employee assistance programs, mental health in the Lakes Region, leadership through the pandemic, training on CPR, and we toured the Laconia Fire Station. Last, I had a chance to visit the Function Hall and see the improvements being done to the interior of the building. Great work by our staff in Facilities/Grounds and Highway Department.

**Town Clerk:** Don’t forget your dog license! Per RSA 466:1, dogs must be licensed by April 30<sup>th</sup> every year. If your dog has received a rabies shot in the past year, please send their rabies certificate. You may obtain your dog license one of four ways:

1. In person: The Town Clerk’s office is open to the public Monday - Friday, 9 AM - NOON & 1 - 4 PM (closed to the public noon - 1 pm).
2. Online: Visit [MoultonboroughNH.gov](http://MoultonboroughNH.gov) and look for “Online Payments” then “Town Clerk Payments” and follow the prompts. We will process the transaction and mail you the new tag.
3. By mail: Send the proper fee, a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope to: Town Clerk’s Office, P.O. Box 15, Moultonborough, NH 03254
4. Through secure payment drop box: Inside an envelope marked “Town Clerk,” place the proper fee, a note with the dog’s name and your phone number, and a self-addressed stamped return envelope. Leave this in the secure drop box outside to the left of Town Hall’s front door. We will mail the new tag to you.

**PRICING:** The fee is \$7.50 for a spayed/neutered dog, \$10 for an unaltered dog, and \$3.00 for the first dog registered to an owner over 65 years (additional dogs are the regular fee). Group rates are available for households with five or more dogs.

We can accept checks made out to *Town of Moultonborough*, cash, or credit cards if paying in person or online. There is a 3% processing fee added by your credit card company for all card transactions. Per state law, a civil forfeiture fine of \$25 will be issued for dogs that remain unlicensed, plus a \$1 per month late penalty. ### **Department of Public Works**

**Facilities & Grounds:** The past week Facilities & Grounds continues to do spring clean ups at the town facilities and cemeteries. We installed the boat ramp dock at states landing and the contractor has installed the new docks at Lee's Mills and Long Island boat ramps. We are working on the Lion's Club kitchen up grades.

**Transfer station:** This week we shipped out 1 container of municipal solid waste = 12 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. The brush pile was burned, and compost turned. Car counts Monday 229, Tuesday 248, Friday 288, Saturday 274, Sunday 283 total of 1322 residents served.

TRK1 2019 Ram 3500 installed aux. fuel tank and toolbox. EQ25 2006 Case 60XT skid steer repaired oil leak at bucket piston. Pull plow frames. Load chip trailer.

### **Public Safety**

**Moultonborough Police Department:** The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 261 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 17 Assist Citizens, 29 Motor Vehicle Stops, 15 Assists to Fire/EMS, 1 Directed Patrols, 4 Arrest, 4 complaints, 2 MV Accidents, 6 MV Complaints, 2 Residential Alarms, 2 Commercial Alarms, and 5 K-9 complaints.

**Training:** April 12<sup>th</sup> thru April 15<sup>th</sup> - MPO Michalski attended Crisis Intervention Training/Pembroke, NH. April 12<sup>th</sup> thru April 14<sup>th</sup> – Taylor Strickland Attended Communication Training Officer Workshop.

**Moultonborough Fire Rescue:** For the period of 04/08/2022 to 04/14/2022, there were sixteen calls for service: There was: 1 - Bark mulch fire, 12 - EMS call, 1 - Power lines on a vehicle with persons entrapped, 1 - Public service, 1 - Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 214. Automatic Aid:** received four times from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents: 1 Year to Date: 21 Percentage of Call Volume: 9.8%**

Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

**Operations:** 4/11 - Chief Bengtson provided a fire code consultation for a wood stove installation at a Spruce Road dwelling that is being offered for sale. 4/14 Monthly meeting with the Call firefighting personnel. Review of apparatus, equipment, training opportunities and operational information. Engine 1 received new batteries from the Town Mechanic. Engine 3 went to Cummins in Concord for a recall issue. Engine 4 went to Lakes Region Fire Apparatus for pump and primer repairs. Several leaking ball valves and a flange were replaced. The fire boat, Boat 1 was placed in service at Lee's Mills for the season. Boat 2 is kept at the Moultonboro Neck fire station on a trailer for respond throughout town.

**Burning Permits:** Fire permits are now required for all open burning. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at [www.NHFirepermit.com](http://www.NHFirepermit.com). The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.

We are moving into a period where the fire danger becomes elevated until things green up and leaf cover develops.
