The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Administration and Finance

Assessing: The deadline has passed for tax year 2022 exemption and credit applications. These applications are now in the verification or approval process. Applicants will receive status notification letters once these processes are complete.

Whitney Consulting Group (WCG) continues their work on pick-up inspections of properties with open building permits or recently closed building permits. Their field staff will be working throughout town. All their field staff will have a photo identification badge and an introduction letter, on town letterhead, from the Town Assessor. The goal is to pick up as much of the new construction as possible, before the first tax bills go out, so that increases in assessments will be spread out over the first and final tax bills.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 7 containers of construction and demolition = 35 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. The brush pile was burned, and the compost pile moved to be screened. Car counts: Monday 315, Tuesday 304, Friday 375, Saturday 342, Sunday 264 total 1600 residents served.

Fleet: TRK3 2018 Ram 3500 recalibrated JANMAR measuring system for road use. 15-R-2 2019 F550 road call to Neck station. Reinstalled turbo hose that popped off. Drove back to shop and reset system. TRK24 2009 Freightliner dump driver reported major air leak. Replaced broken fitting at passenger front rail.

CAR141 2014 Ford Police Interceptor Utility replaced front control arm bushings, pulled rear sub frame down to extract broken bolts in pass. rear upper control arm. Replaced bushings and rear shocks. Check for state inspection. Loaded chip trailer twice.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 214 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 4 Assist Citizens, 16 Motor Vehicle Stops, 6 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 3 complaints, 2 MV Accidents, 5 MV Complaints, 3 Residential Alarms, 0 Commercial Alarms, and 3 K-9 complaints.

Training: April 25-27th, MO Jaclyn Cortese Cyber Training. April 26th, MPO Michalski Sniper Training.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 04/22/2022 to 04/28/2022, there were eleven calls for service: There was: 1 - Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 3 - EMS call, 3 - Unauthorized burning, 2 - Alarm system activations due to malfunction, 1 - Alarm system activation, no fire, unintentional, 1 - Public service. **Total 2022 Incidents:** 236. **Automatic Aid:** received once from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** none. **Overlapping Incidents:** 3 **Year to Date:** 24. **Percentage of Call Volume:** 10.1%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 4/25 - Moultonborough firefighters joined Center Harbor firefighters in training for calling a May Day. A May Day is a situation in which a firefighter becomes disoriented, lost, injured, trapped, or develops a problem with their protective equipment and needs assistance. The intent of the training was to train personnel to recognize those situations and how to summon assistance and communicate with the rescuers.

The fire Chief and the Day crew met with members of the Suissevale Property Owners Association to propose changing the location of the dry hydrant at Suissevale Beach. If approved the work will be scheduled in the fall. The new location will provide better access and be less susceptible to ice damage during the winter.

4/27 - Chief Bengtson performed an oil burner inspection at an Edgewater Drive residence. Throughout the weekend the Day Crew and Call firefighters performed spring hydrant service.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that “written permission” must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

- Category 1: fire permits are for fires not larger than 2-feet in diameter, at least 25-feet from and structure and ringed by non-combustible material. They may be kindled at any time of the day.
- Category 2: fire permits are for fires not larger than 4-feet in diameter, at least 50-feet from and structure and ringed by non-combustible material. They may be only kindled between 5pm to 9am.
- Category 3: fire permits are typically for burning brush. They must be at least 50-feet from and structure and ringed by non-combustible material. They may be only kindled between 5pm to 9am.

All fire permit holders are required to be able to control the fire and have a means for extinguishing the fire. If you are unable to control or extinguish the fire, call 9-1-1.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.

Conditions persist where the fire danger has become elevated. Residents can subscribe to receive the Daily Fire Danger at https://maillist.nh.gov/list/dnrc_fpb/?p=subscribe&id=11. Moultonborough is in Zone #3
