The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 2 containers of municipal solid waste = 24 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons and 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons. Brush pile was piled in preparation to burn and compost pile was turned.

Car counts Monday 266, Tuesday 370, Friday 413, Saturday closed (Town Meeting), Sunday 575 total 1624 residents served.

Fleet: Car151 2015 Ford Police Interceptor Utility performed PM-B service, swapped out snow tires for summer tires. Replaced lower control arm bushings for front units. Road test as required. EQ12 2009 John Deere 310 backhoe repaired passenger sidestep. Worked on repairing front bucket. TRK18 2010 Dodge Grand Caravan pulled old a/c and heater coolant lines out and replaced with new ones. Evacuated air conditioning system and refilled. Refilled coolant system and checked for leaks. TRK43 2019 Ford E450 coach bus pick up and get ready for town meeting. EQ23 2009 John Deere 772GP grader repaired steps. EQ14 2015 Cat 926M loader lube machine and fill def tank. Checked tires also.

Public Safety

Moultonborough Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 295 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 13 Assist Citizens, 28 Motor Vehicle Stops, 21 Assists to Fire/EMS, 0 Directed Patrols, 3 Arrest, 8 complaints, 6 MV Accidents, 3 MV Complaints, 4 Residential Alarms, 1 Commercial Alarms, and 7 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue: For the period of 05/09/2022 to 05/15/2022, there were twelve calls for service: There was: 1 Building fire - mutual aid to North Conway to the Red Jacket Inn, 1 Excessive heat, scorch burns with no ignition, 8 - EMS call, 1 Assist the Police. **Total 2022 Incidents: 237.** **Automatic Aid:** received twice, once from Tuftonboro and once from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** given once to North Conway and received once from Center Harbor. **Overlapping Incidents: 2.** **Year to Date: 23.** **Percentage of Call Volume:** 9.7%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: **4/30** - Moultonborough firefighters responded on special request to North Conway for a third alarm fire at the Red Jacket Mountain View Hotel. The Department sent an engine and a tanker to the scene. Arriving around 5:30pm, Moultonborough personnel worked on hose line crews and interior overhaul teams. Moultonborough firefighters return to in service status at 11:15pm. **5/3** - Chief Bengtson conducted a place of assembly inspection at a Whittier Highway restaurant. **5/4** - Lt. Frangelli, firefighter Brown and Chief Bengtson attend a continuing education training session in Center Harbor. The guest speaker was Justin Romanello, Chief of the Bureau of EMS, who presented a program on Bleeding Control. Chief Bengtson attended the LRMFA Executive Committee and Board of Directors meeting in Laconia at the Communication Center. **5/5** - Lt. Frangelli and Call firefighters Furtado and Gatherum tested hose. The Department annually tests approximately 22,000 feet of attack and supply hose.

Burning Permits: Conditions persist where the fire danger has become elevated. Residents can subscribe to receive the Daily Fire Danger at https://maillist.nh.gov/list/dnrc_fpb/?p=subscribe&id=11. Moultonborough is in Zone #3

Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
