The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Facilities and Grounds: The past week the Facilities & Grounds crew has been raking and cleaning the beaches, boat ramps. The crew continues to mow and trim town properties and cemeteries. We are finishing up on the lions club project and the painters have finished at the public safety building apparatus bay.

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 3 containers of single stream recycle = 15 tons, 6 containers of construction and demolition = 30 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Brush pile was burned, and compost pile was turned. Car counts Monday 350, Tuesday 364, Friday 461, Saturday 302 Sunday 239 total of 1716 residents served.

Moultonborough Public Safety

Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 308 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 11 Assist Citizens, 28 Motor Vehicle Stops, 12 Assists to Fire/EMS, 2 Directed Patrols, 2 Arrest, 4 complaints, 5 MV Accidents, 3 MV Complaints, 3 Residential Alarms, 1 Commercial Alarms, and 0 K-9 complaints.

Training: June 7th, Officer Beaudet attended Interview and Interrogation training. June 8th, Lt. Lipson attended a Mental Health Training in Concord. June 9th Department CPR/AED and NARCAN training

Fire Department: For the period of 06/06/2022 - 06/12/2022, there were eighteen calls for service: There was: 7 - EMS incidents, 1 - Motor vehicle accident with injuries, 1 - Public Service, 2 - Assist the physically disabled, 1 - Dispatched & Cancelled en-route, 1 - Authorized controlled burning, 3 - Alarm systems activation due to malfunction, 2 - Alarm system activations, no fire, unintentional. **Total 2022 Incidents: 372.** **Automatic Aid:** received three times, twice from Center Harbor and once from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** given once to Tamworth. **Overlapping Incidents: 5.** **Year to Date: 68.** **Percentage of Call Volume:** 18.2%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 6/7 - Chief Bengtson attended the Executive Committee meeting of the LRMFA Board of Directors in Laconia at the Communication Center. 6/8 - Chief Bengtson and Firefighter Gravelle attended a demonstration of AquaEye at Bond Beach on Lake Opechee in Laconia. AquaEye is a handheld sonar device used to find missing persons in the water, resulting in in quicker victim recovery. The Lakes Region Mutual Fire Aid system is considering a potential grant application to allow placing these units with every member community with a water body response area.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. If the Daily Fire Danger is "HIGH," Category 3 fire permits will not be issued on-line or at the fire station.

→ Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
