The following report from town departments provides an update for the Board of Selectmen on the various programs, initiatives, projects, and upcoming events.

Department of Public Works

Transfer station: This week we shipped out 3 containers of municipal solid waste = 36 tons, 2 containers of single stream recycle = 10 tons, 9 containers of construction and demolition = 45 tons and 1 container of mixed scrap metal. Compost pile turned and brush pile burned.

Flag Day was June 14th and Boy scout troop 142 picked up all of the American flags that had been collected at the Transfer Station. An official flag burning ceremony to properly dispose of the flags was held at the Moultonborough town hall that evening. Thank you to troop 142 for providing a great service to the residents of Moultonborough.

Car counts: Monday 364, Tuesday 459, Friday 474, Saturday 384, Sunday 263 total 1936 residents served.

Moultonborough Public Safety

Police Department: The Moultonborough Police Department recorded 335 log entries, which included the following calls for service, 11 Assist Citizens, 26 Motor Vehicle Stops, 21 Assists to Fire/EMS, 3 Directed Patrols, 16 Arrest, 5 complaints, 11 MV Accidents, 5 MV Complaints, 3 Residential Alarms, 4 Commercial Alarms, and 4 K-9 complaints.

Moultonborough Fire Rescue Department: For the period of 06/13/2022-06/19/2022, there were thirty-five calls for service: There was: 3 - EMS incidents, 2 - Motor vehicle accident with injuries, 3 - Motor vehicle accidents without injuries, 1 - Carbon monoxide incident, 1 - Building/structure weakened or collapsed, 1 - Assist the Police, 1 - Public service, 2 - Assist the physically disabled, 1 - Dispatched & Cancelled en-route, 1 - No incident found upon arrival at dispatched location, 1 - Smoke detector activation due to malfunction, 1 - Alarm systems activation due to malfunction. **Total 2022 Incidents: 407.** **Automatic Aid:** received four times, twice from Center Harbor and twice from Stewart's Ambulance. **Mutual Aid:** given once to Center Harbor and once to Waterville Valley. **Overlapping Incidents:** 8. **Year to Date:** 76 Percentage of Call

Volume: 18.7%. Overlapping incidents are where two or more incidents are occurring simultaneously.

Operations: 6/15 - The Day Shift and Chief Bengtson conducted at Youth Camp inspection at 100 Sibley Road. Chief Bengtson performed a Daycare inspection at 903 Whitter Highway. 6/16 - The Fire Chief and Code Enforcement Officer met with representatives of the New Hampshire Boat Museum for a walk-through tour of the building at 130 Whittier Highway. The tour was to receive input from the two-code official on proposed options for the museum. EMS Continuing Education training on new Zoll cardiac monitor/defibrillators.

Burning Permits: Fire permits are required for all open burning. If you are burning wood, you need a fire permit. 2022 Fire permits are available at the Public Safety Building and on-line at www.NHFirepermit.com. The fee for an online fire permit is \$5.50. The Town of Moultonborough does not control, run, or manage the online permit system. If the Daily Fire Danger is "HIGH," Category 3 fire permits will not be issued on-line or at the fire station.

→ Property owners with rental properties are reminded that "written permission" must be given to anyone renting the property to kindle a fire on the property being rented. The letter of permission must indicate the category of fire allowed and the duration in which the renter is permitted to kindle the fire.

RSA 125-N:4 Prohibits the open burning of combustible domestic waste. "Combustible domestic waste" means combustible waste such as, but not limited to, household trash, packaging materials, plastics, coated or laminated papers, rubber, painted, or treated wood, coated, or treated cardboard, oily rags, and animal, vegetable, and kitchen waste.
